#On Tuesday morning last we received the melancholy intelligence that Mr Askews yacht the Waterwitch had been capsized at the Croixelles and that Mrs Hays wife of Captain William H Hays of the brigantine Black Diamond and infant aged thirteen months, Mrs Hayes brother aged twenty three years and a servant girl aged fifteen years had all been drowned and the boat sunk. The brigantine was lying at tile Croixelles for the purpose of being caulked and Captain Hays hearing that Mrs Rankin at Mr Askew's run was not in good health he and Mrs Hays determined on visiting her and with this object had borrowed Mr Askew yacht and set sail between ten and eleven o'clock on the morning of Friday last. After they had proceeded about one mile from the shore the boat in which they were in was struck by willy waugh (a sudden squall of wind to which the neighbourhood is liable) which at once capsized her and she sank by the stern. Captain Hays immediately seized his wife and child and with one on

each arm and assisted by two oars struck out for the shore. The little child Captain Hays kept on his right shoulder for some time until feeling assured that it was dying he said to his wife Rosy Rosy sissy's gone but meeting with no response he placed the child's face against that of its mother in order that she might give it a last kiss. A short time after feeling assured that it was quite dead, he let go of it in order to render greater assistance to his wife whose head had now begun to droop beneath the water. He placed his wife partially upon his back and still struggled towards the shore but soon to become too painfully aware that death had visited her also. He still exerted what remained of his strength to get her to the shore but all his efforts were unavailing and, feeling that he was becoming powerless and would himself be drowned if he longer attempted to support his wife's now lifeless body he let it go from him (this was after having been in the water nearly two hours) and eventually reached some rocks and scrambled up them. Here it is presumed he slept for a short time. Captain Hays then appears to have wandered about in an unconscious state though he had an indistinct remembrance of having climbed an eminence to get some flax to tie his coat together he having when first thrown into the water torn it up the back in order if possible to divest himself of it. He then walked along and was eventually seen from the deck of his vessel holding up his arms and seemed as though imploring assistance. Those on board knew not who it was but immediately despatched a boat only to learn that it was their captain the only survivor of those who had so recently left them. As showing what frightful exertions Captain Hays must have made we are informed that large lumps had swollen upon his legs which appeared perfectly black. The servant girl sank alongside the Waterwitch and was never again seen Mrs Hays' brother attempted to reach the shore by swimming but he also was not again seen. The body of the child and the hat of Mrs Hays were picked up on the Boulder Bank on the following day. On the news reaching Nelson the Superintendent despatched a constable to the Croixelles for the purpose of rendering assistance in the recovery of the bodies reference Papers past website Nelson Examiner and New Zealand Chronicle newspaper 25 August 1864
