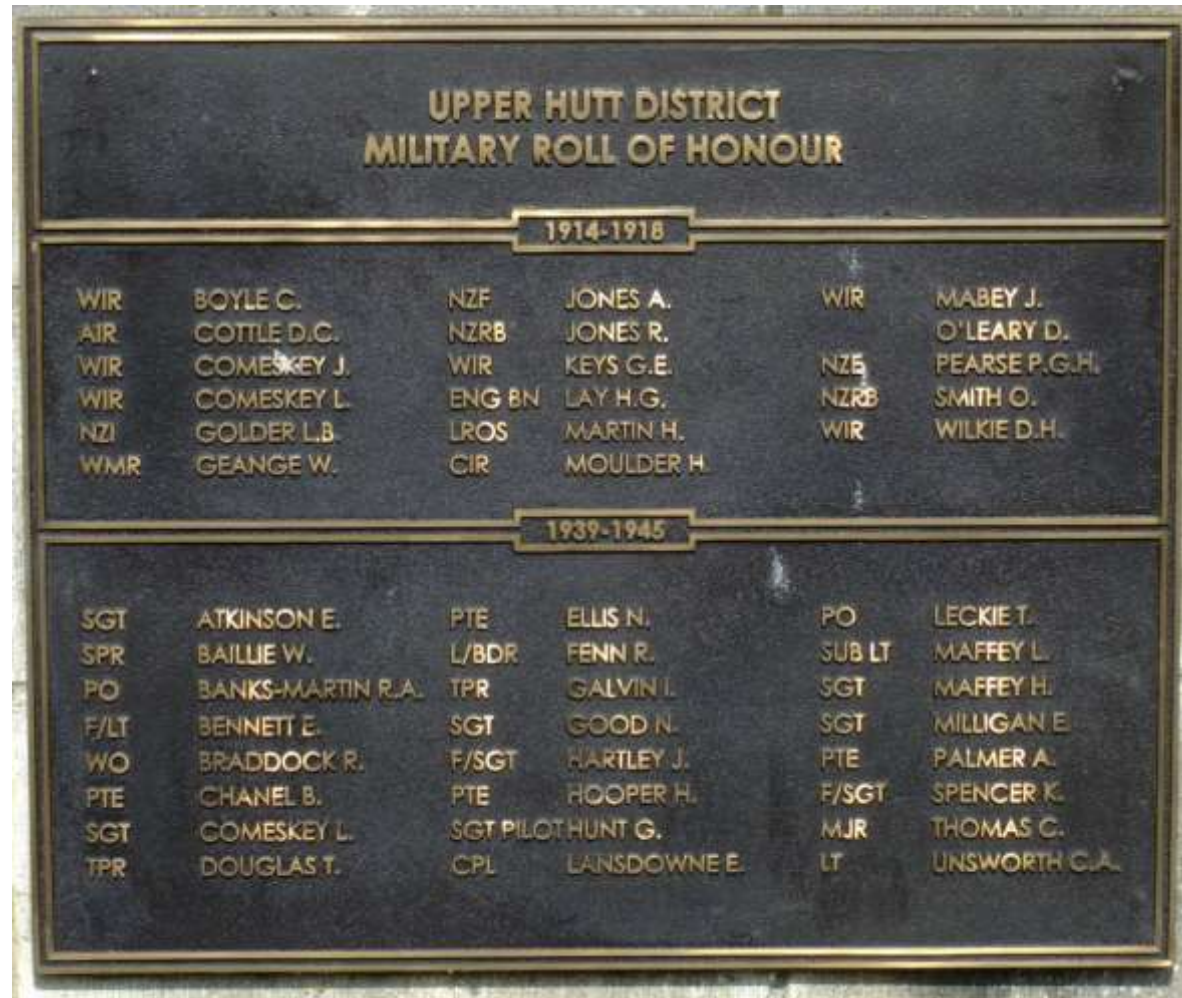


UPPER HUTT WORLD WAR ONE (1914 – 1918) ROLL OF HONOUR

The document was first placed on the website 24 April one day before Anzac Day in the year 2014.

The Upper Hutt District Military Roll of Honour plaque in front of the Upper Hutt City Council building on Fergusson Drive Upper Hutt New Zealand records the names of 17 World War One and 24 World War Two service personnel.



LOCAL AND NATIONAL ROLLS OF HONOUR

This document was created as a way of acknowledging as many of the World War One service personnel who were associated with the Upper Hutt district. It is important to understanding the different criteria for inclusion on Rolls of Honour both nationally and locally.

The Commonwealth War Graves (formerly Imperial War Graves) criteria for entitlement on the World War One National Roll of Honour are that a service person must have died between the dates of 04 August 1914 and 31 August 1921.

In 1924 the Defence department published "*The Great War 1914-1918 New Zealand Expeditionary Force Roll of Honour*" that recorded service personnel who died up to the date of 31 December 1923. The three sections list [1] service personnel who died while serving [2] service personnel who died after discharge from wounds or disease contracted while serving [3] service personnel who died while training which includes those who died of influenza at the Featherston Military camp.

The New Zealand Returned Services Association was founded in 1916 by wounded veterans returning from World War One. It would be some time before local RSA branches were formed. So many RSA's had no involvement in the first locally built Rolls of Honour.

The Upper Hutt RSA was formed in 1930 as a sub branch of the Wellington RSA and became an independent branch in 1947.

After World War One local city, borough and county Councils throughout New Zealand formed committees and invited local residents to make donations and/or nominate former service personnel to be recorded on locally built Rolls of Honour. There were no rules or guidelines each Council accepted the resident's nominations in good faith and all donations were gratefully accepted. This is why local Rolls of Honour differ from the National Roll of Honour.

Some memorial authorities have required a list limited strictly to those who have enlisted in their district. Others have included the men who were resident in the district at the time of their enlistment, although enlistment took place in another part of the Dominion. Others, again, have further extended the list by adding to these two classes the names of men who, although they lived in other districts and enlisted there, were born and educated in the district where the memorial was being erected. There have been cases where the list was made still wider by the inclusion of the names of men whose next-of-kin resided in the district concerned, although the men had not been associated with the community.

Some local rolls record the names of service personnel who served with the Australian and/or British Imperial Force. Many service personnel are not recorded on their local rolls as nobody nominated them for one reason or another.

Please remember that local Rolls of Honour are not a true reflection of just how many local residents made that final sacrifice for their Country.

UPPER HUTT WAR MEMORIALS

The first Upper Hutt district War memorial was the lych gate and stone wall built (in memory of Our War Fallen Soldiers) at the main road (now Fergusson Drive) entrance to St John Church in Trentham. The memorial lych gate was dedicated on April 1925 and the plaque reads "*This gate was erected to the glory of God and in memory of those members of the Church of England who from Trentham Upper Hutt and surrounding districts laid down their lives in the Great War August 1914 November 1918*". I was told that some early Anzac celebrations were held by the lych gate.

The Returned Solders Association and Upper Hutt Council began discussion about erecting a War Memorial. Details were published in the local newspaper and can be found at the end of this document. In 1937 it was published that there were no official War Memorials in Upper Hutt.

At Trentham Memorial Park a stone wall and memorial gates were built. Years later they were removed but what happened to the gates is unknown.

On 13 December 1958 the Maidstone War Memorial Swimming Baths were opened and a Memorial plaque was positioned near the entrance to the baths. In 1973 the memorial was removed and placed in front of the Upper Hutt City Council building in Fergusson Drive Upper Hutt. In the following century the memorial was repositioned, a memorial wall was built and statue of a grandfather with his granddaughter were added.

WORLD WAR ONE ROLL OF HONOUR list of Service Personnel associated with UPPER HUTT

I began with the 17 names (**typed in blue**) recorded on the Upper Hutt memorial plaque. The plaque honoured the ANZAC spirit by including a serviceman who served with the Australian Imperial Force and honoured a serviceman who died after discharge from wounds received while serving.

The Upper Hutt and Mangaroa School established their own war memorial boards and these names are included in the list below.

During World War One the local Upper Hutt newspaper "*Hutt Valley Independent*" published various articles which listed some of service personnel associated with the district. Other sources used were the World War One nominal rolls (publications & NZSG CD), Commonwealth War Graves website, New Zealand Defence Force Archives, Archives New Zealand, National Library of New Zealand, Papers Past website, Auckland War Memorial Museum Cenotaph database and Ancestry website along with various other resources and publications.

This document records the names of World War One service personnel who died and in one way or another were associated with the Upper Hutt district. Some dwelled in the district, others were born there or former school pupils. Some were employed (NZ Railways & sawmills) and/or had relatives living in the Upper Hutt district.

This document is a work in progress. When I locate additional names or information I update the details and the website. As the documents content is always changing I decided to no longer keep totals of the Service Personnel associated with the Upper Hutt district.

He was born in Gisborne and his mother dying when he was but a small boy he lived with his aunt (Mrs C E Major) until his father re-married. He was educated at Wellington College and when the War broke out he was full of eagerness and patriotic ardour to enlist. But he was much below the military age. However he found a way to get through. Being a large and well-developed lad he offered for the 9th Reinforcements gave his age at 20 and was accepted. As a matter of fact his 18th birthday only arrived to-morrow (Saturday) and he has already found a grave. He was in the trenches "Somewhere in France" as early as May last, so that he must have been in the firing line, for four months. During those four months his letters home to his stepmother have been bright and full of hope. In one of his last he wrote "I think I must bear a charmed life I have had no end of narrow escapes." Poor lad the end was then so near. Cyril's elder brother Aubrey Robert Fernandez (also of the New Zealand Rifle Brigade) went away with the 14th Reinforcements. He fought on the Gallipoli peninsular receiving seven bullet wounds in his last engagement. After some local treatment he was invalided to England and placed in St Thomas Hospital London where six of his wounds speedily healed. The seventh which ultimately caused his death nearly severed his spine and caused paralysis below the wound. His case was pronounced hopeless but his cheeriness and determination to get well endeared him to all who came in contact with him inspired them with a hope that he might win after all. Everything possible was done by the men and women of the staff and by visitors and his doctors and nurses (Sister Victoria in particular) were delighted to find him partially receiving the use of his paralysed body. He was subsequently transferred to the New Zealand Hospital at Walton on Thames and from there sent later on to Wellington Hospital he was removed to Rotorua Hot Springs Military Hospital where he received special treatment until his death. While in England he twice received recognition from royalty first at Westminster Abbey at the Anzac Memorial Service when the King (according to the cablegrams) stopped and conversed and shook hands with Trooper Geange of Upper Hutt and second when he was the guest of the King and Queen one afternoon at Buckingham Palace. The body was brought to Upper Hutt for burial last Sunday and was tardily accorded a military funeral after we had delivered last Sundays Independent. In accordance with instructions of Colonel Robin a firing party of soldiers and the Trentham Camp Band were detailed to attend by Colonel Potter meanwhile the local Territorials Senior Cadets and National Reservists who intended to attend the funeral were circularised by leaflet in the Independent and invited to muster at Record Hall. A good number responded and marched down to Mr Geange's house reaching there coincident with the force from Trentham Camp. Sergt. Hughenden Lynch was in command of No 37 Company Upper Hutt Senior Cadets, Corpl. Kenneth McCurdy the Upper Hutt platoon D Company 5th Territorial Regiment and Lieut. A J McCurdy the Upper Hutt unit of D Company 2nd Regiment National Reserve. There was also a large following of friends and relatives of the deceased popular soldier. The service at St John' and at the graveside was conducted by the Bishop of Wellington and the Rev A D Stratford MA vicar. Corporal Wallie Geange was nearly 27 years old at the time of death which occurred after some two years illness. The deceased was a tram conductor and whilst off duty on Tuesday morning he jumped off a moving tram in Manners Street with the result that he sustained injuries which brought about his death at the Wellington Hospital on Thursday morning. Mr W G Riddell SM investigated the happenings and Senior Sergeant Willis conducted the inquiry on behalf of the police. Dr Waterworth house surgeon at the Wellington Hospital said that when admitted the deceased was suffering from a fracture of the right leg and shock. He appeared to make good recovery but on the morning of August 27 there were definite symptoms of gas gangrene a disease which had been very common in France. Witness considered that death was due to severe septic poisoning due to gas gangrene caused by infection of the wound on deceased's broken leg by the street soil. Eric Sydney tram conductor said, that deceased was a returned soldier and on Tuesday morning was travelling on witness's car as a passenger. Shortly after leaving the stop at the Cuba and Manners Streets intersection witness felt a slight bump and gave the emergency signal. The tram was promptly pulled up and the deceased was found lying beside the car just clear of the track. He was carried to Mr McKenzie's pharmacy for attention. The tram would be travelling at about 12 miles per hour at the moment of the accident but witness knew nothing of how it happened. The deceased was an active young man and perfectly sober. Arthur Barnett motorman of the tram said that he had spoken to the deceased on Tuesday morning and was aware that he was going to call at an outfitter's shop in Manners Street. The deceased was sitting in the front compartment of the tram and as he neared his destination he stepped down to the front step and said he was getting off. The next witness heard was the emergency bell. He stopped the tram promptly. Witness had heard that deceased had a weak ankle and this no doubt caused him to slip. Constable Healey said deceased was quite conscious after the accident and had stated that as he stepped from the car his foot doubled under him and he fell. He said that he was solely to blame for the accident. Deceased was perfectly sober. Evidence was given by a brother of the deceased to the effect that deceased was a single male 24 years of age and a returned soldier. Deceased suffered from a weak ankle as it had been broken on Gallipot. The coroner said that it was very sad that a young man who had passed through all the</p>

			<p>dangers of war should have met his death in the manner he did. Had his ankle been sound the accident would probably not have occurred but there was always a considerable risk in stepping from a moving vehicle. The verdict would be in accordance with the medical testimony. No blame was attachable to the driver or the conductor of the tramcar. The Funeral - The late Mr Gurden will be accorded a full military funeral on Sunday morning. The cortege is to leave the mortuary chapel of Messrs R H Wilson and Son, John Street at 9.30 am and will proceed via the city streets to the Karori Cemetery. The Tramway Band will be in attendance. Special arrangements have been made for trams to convey friends one leaving Thorndon at 8.45 am and one Island Bay at the same hour for Newtown. UPPER HUTT WAR MEMORIALS – RETURNED SOLDIERS ASSOCIATION

The Returned Solders Association and Upper Hutt Council began discussion about erecting a War Memorial. Details were published in the local newspaper and can be found below.

Upper Hutt Weekly Review newspaper 15 May 1936

War Memorial – Councillor Blewman asked the Mayor if he could say how much money was raised some years ago towards a war memorial for the district. He had been asked on Anzac Day by members of the Returned Soldiers Association to see if something could not be done about a memorial

In 1937 it was published that there were no official War Memorials in Upper Hutt. The Upper Hutt Council and Upper Hutt Returned Services Association began discussions regarding a War Memorial for the Upper Hutt district.

Upper Hutt Returned Soldier's Association - Memorial Hall for the District

A deputation from the Upper Hutt Returned Soldier's Association met the Council on Saturday last to go into the matter of a Memorial Hall. The deputation was led by the president of the branch (Mr S F Carver). He pointed out to the members of the Council that there was no memorial in the district in memory of the boys who left the Upper Hutt and that a memorial of iron or stone was a poor way to memorise the dead. Mr Carver stated that it was the intention of the branch to give the general public the opportunity of subscribing towards the project and with the co-operation of the Council something worthwhile could be accomplished. Councillor Greig said Upper Hutt was one of the few places where there was no war memorial and he would heartily support the idea. Councillor Guthrie said that a memorial hall was an excellent idea and he was of the same opinion as the R S A president that iron and stone was not the right thing. Councillor Keys also agreed it was a move in the right direction and suggested that the Council get in behind the association and help all it possibly could. Councillor Sutherland, who is an ex-marine captain and a member of the R S A, stated that anything that was given towards such an ideal was little enough to honour those who had fought for the Empire in the Great War. Councillor Purvis stated that it was astounding that Upper Hutt had no memorial, especially considering that practically every man who went to the War was at one time or another through the camp at Trentham. The returned men could rely upon him to help in every possible way to gain their objective. The Mayor thanked the president for bringing the matter forward and promised that the Council would bring down a report at the next council meeting. The members of the deputation, through the president, thanked the Council for receiving them. The deputation consisted of Messrs S F Carver, H Polson, R Robinson, W C Walsh and the secretary of the branch.

The Mayor said that the council intended to give the movement recognition and support as soon as any definite information was forthcoming from the branch.

I do not know when the Trentham Memorial Park stone wall and memorial gates were built. Years later they were removed and what happened to them is not known.

On 13 December 1958 the Maidstone War Memorial Swimming Baths were opened and a Memorial plaque was positioned near the entrance to the baths. In 1973 the memorial was removed and placed in front of the Upper Hutt City Council building in Fergusson Drive Upper Hutt. In the following century the memorial was repositioned, a memorial wall was built and statue of a grandfather with his granddaughter was added.
