Mary Ethel MANSSEN was born 14 May 1879 Stoke Suburban South Nelson NZ. Her parent's were Emma Elizabeth formerly MARRIS age 26 years born Sheffield England and Charles Frederick MANSSEN age 31 years occupation labourer. Her parents married on 03 June 1874 in Wellington NZ. Charles Frederick MANSSEN father Labourer of Stoke registered the birth on 21 June 1879. The registrar was Robert KIRTON. Mary was the fifth child of fifteen born to Emma and Charles and like her brothers and sisters she attended Stoke School. Later her parents moved to Toi Toi Valley Nelson.

One of the memories Mary related of her early years was how her mother had been known on occasions to put bonnets on the younger boys in the family. This supposedly prevented their being vulnerable to the teat of Maori skirmishes.



They remained in Hataitai Road for the rest of their lives. While travelling between the North and South Island, relatives often stayed with the Cooks, enabling Mary to keep in touch with her family. A nephew Norman MANSSEN junior lived with the family while attending Victoria University.

Mary was well known for her hospitality and home making. She was a superb cook – a fact much appreciated by grandchildren on their Sunday visits. The groaning afternoon tea trolley was a reliable source of pleasure. A member of the Anglican Church Mary regularly attended All Saints Church Kilbirnie.

During the Second World War both Mary's sons joined the Forces and served in England. Noel in the Royal Navy and Bryan in the Air Force. Sadly only Noel returned. In 1943, some twenty years after the death of Charles Mary's mother, Emma, came to live with her. Emma later moved on to her son, Frederick MANSSEN and his wife Ruby, in Wanganui, as Hataitai Road became filled with returning younger generation. Daughter Gwen, her husband Roderick FRASER and their two young sons, Donald and Bryan (named after their uncle lost in the War) came from Dunedin to live with her parents while Rod was in camp at Ohakea, Their twin daughters, Barbara and Margaret, were born while at Hataitai, and a third daughter, Lesley, shortly after they moved to Newtown. Before the end of the War, Noel COOK married Doreen CAREY, and David was born in England. On their return to New Zealand, Noel and Doreen stayed briefly at Hataitai before moving to their own home at Titahi Bay. They also had twins a girl, Rosemary, and a boy, Richard, Mary loved having her family around.

The oldest of the family, Thelma Jean (known always as Jean) lived away from Wellington. She married Francis DWYER (also a Post Office employee (and they began their married life in Masterton, moving later to Palmerston North, Their six children Albert, Lawrie, Keith, Shirley, Mary and Patricia were all born in Masterton.

Albert Ernest COOK age 75 years born Wellington, retired Civil Servant died on the 5th November 1955 at Wellington Public Hospital formerly from 78 Hataitai Road Wellington. Cause of death was Myocardial infarction 10 weeks as certified by Dr C A MACLEOD who saw him last on 04 November 1955. His parents were Dina STEINMULLER and Louie COOK. He was buried by the Anglican minister Rev D B MALCOLM on 07 November 1955 at Karori cemetery. Albert was age 24 when he married in Nelson to Mary Ethel MANSSEN. His widow was aged 76 years and living issue 1 male age 40 years and 2 females age 50 and 46 years. W A WILSON the Funeral Director of Wellington registered the death on 09 November 1955.

Mary much loved in her old age, was supported by her daughter, Gwen, and son Noel. Weekly family gatherings at Titahi Bay on Sundays provided many happy memories for her grandchildren. In spite of increasing deafness, she kept up a keen interest in all the young people's activities. Her deafness in fact became a lively source of fun as she was persuaded to grapple with the technology of a hearing aid. Her ability to laugh at herself was an endearing characteristic.

Mary Ethel COOK formerly MANSSEN age 88 years born Nelson widow died 31 March 1968 at Public Hospital Wellington formerly from 78 Hataitai Road Wellington. Cause of death was Myocardial infarction, congestive Heart failure 2 years as certified by Dr C J CALCINAI [sic] who saw her last on 30 March 1968. Her parents were Emma Elizabeth formerly MARRIS and Charles Frederick MANSSEN occupation Labourer. Mary was cremated at Karori cemetery on 02 April 1968. Mary was age 25 years when she married Albert Ernest COOK in Nelson. Her living issue were 1 male age 52 years and 2 females age 62 & 58 years.
