His Worship gave judgment in favour of Carlson on the grounds (1) that Semeloff had failed to establish that the goods were in charge of Carlson as an innkeeper, and (2) that Semeloff had been guilty of negligence in the care of his property. Mr Justice Edwards held that there was evidence to justify the Magistrate in, finding that the loss would not have happened if Semeloff had taken care to place the goods in Carlson's hands for safe custody in the hotel. His Honour therefore dismissed the appeal with costs (£7 7s). The traveller went to fetch a pail of water for Mrs Corcoran, and, on looking up, observed the roof of the building to be on fire. He instantly gave the alarm, when every effort was made to extinguish the flames, but the fire had taken such firm hold, that it was found impossible for two persons to slay its progress. They

managed, however, to save two casks and an armful of bedding, but the heat soon became so intense as, to prevent their approaching the building. The house belonged to Mr Walter Hodder, and was insured in the London and Liverpool and New Zealand Office for £400. The furniture and stock belonged to Mr Corcoran, and were insured in the New Zealand Insurance Office for £600. Mr Hodder considers that, he will lose about £200 by the fire. (Halfway House – Shepherd Inn – Criterion Hotel)

Hutt Licensing Court – Criterion Hotel Upper Hutt - Applicant <u>Thomas George Dugard</u> on whose behalf Mr Quirk appeared. A complaint was made to the effect that the house was not well conducted. Mr Quick said he thought the report must refer to the time prior to Mr Dugard being the proprietor of the Criterion Hotel. Constable Lyster said No the misconduct had taken place since the present landlord's time. Inspector Atchison suggested that the constable should be sworn. Constable Lyster was accordingly sworn. He stated that on the 14th of last month there were a lot of drunken men turned out of the house, and the house was noted for fighting and drunkenness. He also stated that Dugard had kept a man there seven days, taken care of his money, £l2 10s, and at the end of that time told him that he had nothing owing to him. This man, Robinson, complained, Constable Lyster, and asked him what, he should do under the circumstances, as he knew he had not spent the whole of his money in the house. In answer to

Mr Quick, Constable Lyster said Robinson was not in attendance. Mr Quick said he objected to hearsay evidence, and called Thomas George Dugard, landlord of the Criterion Hotel, who denied that his house was of a rowdy character, or that any fighting had taken place on the day mentioned by the constable. As to the man Robinson, mentioned by Constable Lyster, the facts were these. He came to the house, and a friend took his money from him and handed it to the landlady to take care of. The man spent the money in the house, drinking himself and shouting drink and refreshments for a number of men who were there. He went away perfectly satisfied. Witness saw him afterwards, when he said that Constable Lyster had told him he would make this money business the subject of a case against witness at the Licensing Court. Inspector Atcheson examined the witness, asking him did he think the bill he had made out for £I2 15s was a fair one, considering the man had only stayed at his house seven days. Constable Gillespie gave evidence to the effect that he lived a little distance from the Criterion Hotel, which he did not look upon as a rowdy house. It was generally quiet here had only been one row there since Mr Dugard took possession. It was a trifling affair, and took place outside the house. All he knew about Robinson's case was that the man came to him stating he had put £I2 10s into Mr Dugard's hands, and asked what he should do. Witness told him that he should go to Dugard and have a settlement. By the Inspector Robinson was in a muddled state when I saw him. Mr Quick called the attention of the Bench to the fact of there being a difference between the evidence of the two constables, and contended that the evidence of Gillespie, whose special duty was in the district surrounding Mr Dugard's hotel, should be sufficient to show that the house had been well conducted and there was no evidence at all as to Robinson's case. Constable Lyster should have his witness in attendance. The Chairman of Commissioners said the Court was of opinion that it could not consider the matter Robinson himself should have been present to give evidence and as the constable of the district had proved that the house was kept in an orderly manner, the Court granted the license.

I sold the property to W H Gilbreith as atonally for Peter Gilbreith the price fixed was ten pounds per acre, the acreage we estimated at 280 more or less a summary was to be made to determine the exact amount, I gave up possession on Saturday February 21st 1880. The money was paid as a deposit but the purchaser agreed to pay 500 on the first of July 1880 and the balance as it suited him during the kind years from the time of his takings possession of the Hotel & Stables in case in secured in September 1879 for £1200 previous to that they had been insured for £2000 for the previous shall years. The reduction in the insurance was to save expenses as I was not making much use of the place. There was a clause in my agreement with Gilbrith that the building should be kept insured for not less than £1200. According to a clause in my agreement Gilbrath can call upon me to except dwellings to the extent of £1200 the amount of the insurance money signed W V Jackson.

It appears that about 5 o'clock on Tuesday evening Mr Gilruth, the occupier, who was busy with his brother at some distance from the hotel, noticed large quantities of smoke issuing from the roof, and on-going to it, found that the flames had obtained such a hold on the upper portion of the building that it became at once apparent that all attempts to save it would only prove hopeless. Only a portion of the furniture was got out. The extensive stables also caught fire, and were burnt to the ground. Nothing whatever is known as to the origin of the fire. The building was the property of Mr W V Jackson,

of this city, and was, together with adjoining land, let to Mr Gilruth, who intends to go in for stock breeding in the locality. The house, which was a very large one, had been closed as an hotel for some time past, the traffic along the road having fallen off to such an extent since the opening of the railway over the Rimutaka that it was found to be a loss. This is the third time that a fire has occurred there. A small building was burnt down a number of years ago, and the comfortable hotel which took its place was destroyed in the same way in 1866. The insurances on the present occasion were Royal, £200; and Colonial, £1000. There was a further policy of £750, but it had been allowed to lapse in order to save expense. The furniture was valued at £300, and had not been insured by Mr Gilruth.

At that time I filed my schedule, owing to pressure by creditors living in Australia. My estate did not pay a dividend. I bought the Railway Hotel at the Upper Hutt with my brother Herman's money in January 1888, for £950, and it was sold in September 1888 for £1250. There was trouble over the sale and I had to make an allowance but how much I cannot say. I went to Richmond in November 1888, and opened a store there. I cannot tell how much money I had when I went to Richmond, but I had £225 when I left in May 1889. I returned to the Upper Hutt, and bought the goodwill of the Provincial Hotel for £100, furniture and stock taken at valuation. I remained there till August of the same year, and sold out, as the business was not paying. I lost £254 10s 6d during the three months I was in this hotel. Johnson & Co, of Wellington, sued me for renovating the hotel, and obtained judgment for £176 5s 3d, which with costs £28 8s 2d, was

paid out of the money I received for the hotel. I had £15 when I left the Upper Hutt in August, 1889. I then rented the White Hart Hotel Nelson. Mr Wm. Tregea lent me the money, taking a bailment over the furniture. I sold out of the White Hart Hotel on 11th March 1890, but after the bailment and all expenses were paid there was little left for me I cannot say how much I got. I then went to Blenheim, intending to open a store there, but after remaining 3 months I left and came to New Plymouth. I began business in July, 1890. At that time I had £40 of my own, and £50 I borrowed from my brother-in-law, Mr Wm Norman, who now lives in Sydney. I also received £27 17s 6d from a firm of auctioneers in Blenheim on 5th July, which makes a total of £117 17s 6d I had available when I began business in New Plymouth. I have since paid my brother-in-law the £50 I borrowed from him, but I do not know when. I never kept an account of any money I borrowed, or of the repayments thereof. My memory is not good, as I had a sunstroke when in India. In the year 1857 Mr Hastwell took up his residence at Greytown, in the cottage which had been erected the previous year opposite the Rising Sun Hotel by Mr Holdsworth, senior where his two surviving children were born and where he subsequently continued to live up to the time of his death, with the exception of a short time he held the position of landlord of the Golden Fleece Pakuratahi, about the year 1861, and during the time he was absent with his family in England, about the year 1865. It was in every respect unfortunate that he took a public house, as it was a business for which he was not adapted, and because it is to be feared he then laid the foundation of habits which proved his bane during the greater portion of the remainder of his extremely active and somewhat eventful life. Had the weather been more favourable it would undoubtedly have been the largest funeral that has ever taken place in the district, as it was there was a very large attendance of mourners from all parts of the valley, there being any number of coaches, carriages, and horsemen, in the procession, which was led by the Freemasons, of whom over fifty were in attendance, the late Mr Hastwell having been a member of the order. The funeral service was read by Mr Teakle of Masterton in which the Masonic brethren took part, accompanied by the usual ceremonies. One of the most striking features was the procession of a large number of coaches and other vehicles from Masterton. The late Mr Hastwell was the son of a Westminster carrier, in which county he continued to reside until he became, of age after which he left his paternal roof for London, where he obtained an engagement in a large furniture warehouse, his business being to take charge of the van. It was in this occupation he was engaged at the beginning of the year 1853, when he accidently met in the street a young lady from his native place, with whom he had been previously intimately acquainted, who was on her way to New Zealand, to join her brother who had previously settled in Otago. The moment he became aware of the fact he resolved to accompany her, and immediately took passage in the same ship (the Tasmanian we believe) in which she was going out, and both arrived, safely in Wellington about the middle of the same year. The next day he obtained an engagement at, Mr Riddiford's station at Te Awaite, and some months afterwards he came to Wellington, where he was married at

St Peter's Church, and immediately after returned to complete his engagement at Mr Riddiford's. That, accomplished, Mr and Mrs Hastwell returned to Wellington, and shortly after took the "Wellington Coffee House," which was them doing an extensive business on Lambton Quay on account of the number of successful diggers, who were at that time weekly arriving at Wellington form Melbourne. He also engaged in the firewood trade between Waiwetu and Wellington, bringing the wood over from the former place by boat. But in neither business was he in his proper element, and in the year 1856 he got into it, by commencing the business for which he had a natural inclination, that of carrier between Wellington and the Wairarapa, first by means of a hired team belonging to Mr Chew, who then resided in Wellington, as a carter and soon after as the owner of a cart ant two horses of his own.

At the time Mr Hastwell commenced the business of a carrier to the Wairarapa about the close of the year 1856, there was scarcely a bridge over any of the streams and rivers between Wellington and Masterton, except that at the Hutt which has just bean re-erected after its destruction by the earthquake of January 1855. The road over the Mungaroa was in course of construction, as was that between the Golden Fleece and the foot of the Rimutaka, and that from the bottom of the hill to Burling's. You had to cross the stream seven or eight times in the latter locality before you could reach the Valley of the Wairarapa. The bare mention of these facts, however, will give the reader but a very inadequate idea of the difficulties that had to be surmounted in establishing dray communication between the Upper Hutt and this district. The two other carriers, then on the road, were Messrs Charles Cudby, and Charles White, both at that time residents at the Hutt. It was no uncommon occurrence to have not one but several capsizes between the Mungaroa river and the foot of the Rimutaka, and we remember the time when, in consequence of these capsizes, the journey between Collins's and Hodder's, a distance of little more than 4½ miles, occupied so much time as to render it not prudent to proceed farther that day, and it frequently happened, on account of the badness of the roads and the flooded state of the rivers, that the journey between Wellington and Masterton, would occupy the greater part of a fortnight. Such was the stale of the roads when Mr Hastwell commenced the business in which he was subsequently so successful, that success being due alone to his own indomitable pluck, punctuality, and perseverance.

In the year 1857 Mr Hastwell took up his residence at Greytown, in the cottage which had been erected the previous year opposite the Rising Sun Hotel by Mr Holdsworth, senior where his two surviving children were born and where he subsequently continued to live up to the time of his death, with the exception of a short time he held the position of landlord of the Golden Fleece Pakuratahi, about the year 1861, and during the time he was absent with his family in England, about the year 1865. It was in every respect unfortunate that he took a public house, as it was a business for which he was not adapted, and because it is to be feared he then laid the foundation of habits which proved his bane during the greater portion of the remainder of his extremely active and somewhat eventful life. Before going to the Pakuratahi he commenced running a one-horse trap, with an occasional outrigger, between Wellington and Greytown and after his return from England he started in the business of coach proprietor, which had been commenced in his absence by Walker and Ray, as well as by Mr Skipper, who had purchased Mr Hastwell's carrying business just before his trip to England. His subsequent career is well known to most of our readers, and needs no extended notice at our hands. It was not, however, because he was a large general carrier, and subsequently an extensive coach proprietor, that we have been induced to notice the above events in his active life, as in these respects it was not distinguished by anything more remarkable than has been experienced by others in either of these capacities, but it was because of the pluck, enterprise, and indomitable perseverance as well as liberal public spirit, he displayed throughout his career which rendered his life alike interesting, instructive, and noteworthy. As a mail carrier, over flooded rivers and unmade roads in a rough country, he stands, unrivalled, and voluminous are the anecdotes that could be related of the hair breath escapes he had to undergo in that capacity. At the time of the Maori war, when there was a regular exodus of the wives and children of Wairarapa settlers to Wellington, and when it was daily expected the King natives would stop the road over the Rimutaka, Mr Hastwell was the man selected by the Government to secretly convey at midnight arms and ammunition to the district, which he successfully accomplished, arriving at Featherston just before the break of

day. Hundreds of other little incidents could be given of a similar character, but perhaps his enterprise was never so favourably exhibited as when he undertook to construct a passable dray road at his own cost to the Taueru, for the purpose of conveying the wool from a station, the proprietor of which was then making a more profitable use of his money by lending it at 20 per cent. The only conditions he insisted upon were that he should have the carrying secured to him at a fixed sum for a period of three years. Some two or three years ago Mr Hastwell had a flattering testimonial presented to him by the settlers of the Wairarapa at the Town Hall, and more recently the children of the Greytown school subscribed a sum for the purpose of obtaining his photograph on account of the liberal interest he had displayed in his capacity of Chairman of the Greytown School Committee. He was for a number of years one of the Churchwardens of St Luke's Church, a member of the first Greytown Local Board, and one of the Waiohine River Commissioners. As an indication of the esteem in which he was held by the ratepayers of Greytown, we may mention at recent election for members of the Borough Council he only wanted one vote from being at the head of the poll. Dr Smith, the present. Mayor, I having seemed the conceded honour by that narrow majority. Mr Hastwell ever carried out, and was indeed the embodiment of the Scriptural injunction, Whatever thy hand undereth to do, do it with all thy might," and the consequence was that there was scarcely anything he undertook he did not, accomplish a lesson which our younger readers will do well to acquire for their own advantage and profit. In private life Mr Hastwell was generous and unobtrusive, and his liberality was of that character recommended by Christ. Not to let thy left I hand know what, thy right hand doeth, and numerous were the acts of this nature that he did which were entirely unknown to the public. Had he been one of those shoddy and veneered individuals of whom there are now too many, all of whose good qualities are worn outside as a cloak for the dross beneath, he would not have obtained this notice from us. After the death of his only son, which he took so deeply to heart, as to almost, alter his character, he has been scarcely the same man as he was before that sad event occurred, and we have heard him repeatedly say he would willingly give up all his wealth if the days when he first knew us could he again restored to him. The Golden Fleece Hotel has again been destroyed by fire. It appears that about 5 o'clock on Tuesday evening Mr Gilruth, the occupier, who was busy with his brother at some distance from

the hotel, noticed large quantities of smoke issuing from the roof, and on-going to it found that the flames had obtained such a hold on the upper portion of the building that it became at once apparent that all attempts to save it would only prove hopeless. Only a portion of the furniture was got out. The extensive stables also caught fire, and were burnt to the ground. Nothing whatever is known as to the origin of the fire. The building was the property of Mr W V Jackson, of this city, and was, together with adjoining land, let to Mr Gilruth, who intends to go in for stock breeding in the locality. The house, which was a very large one, had been closed as an hotel for some time past, the traffic along the road having fallen off to such an extent since the opening of the railway over the Rimutaka that it was found to be a loss. This is the third time that a fire has occurred there. A small building was burnt down a number of years ago, and the comfortable hotel which took its place was destroyed in the same way in 1866. The insurances on the present occasion were Royal, £200; and Colonial, £1000. There was a further policy of £750, but it had been allowed to lapse in order to save expense. The furniture was valued at £300, and had not been insured by Mr Gilruth.

On Sunday the 17th of the month, he saw the prisoners at his house about 1 o'clock that morning, and they left on the following Sunday morning. The prisoners had stayed at the hotel all the previous evening, saying in fact that they were chums, and would like to sleep in the same room. On the following Sunday morning, between 7 and 8 o'clock, Shine, one of the prisoners before the Court, came to him and asked if he carried a revolver. Witness observed about the peculiarity of carrying such a weapon, when he observed that he always carried such. Cross-examined, Witness asked to look at it, and on being shown it, and finding it loaded, he kept it. The pistol he found to be loaded, and in excuse the prisoner stated he had been robbed In Auckland, and always carried a revolver with him. The pistol produced was the same as that presented to him, and the box of caps and bullets were also the same. Joseph Devonshire, a waiter in the hotel in which the prisoners resided, deposed that on the evening of the date referred to he placed his trousers, containing a sum of £2 7s 6d, close by his bed, and very soon afterwards heard cries proceeding from one of the rooms, in consequence of which he at once went down stairs. The prisoners by that time were in the passage, and got away. Sergeant Smith deposed to the finding of a certain amount of money in possession of the prisoners, and the case was then remanded for a week. #Mr McGovern's Death - Eighth Victim of Hutt Explosion - Very general regret is felt at the death of Mr Virgil McGovern, the eighth victim of the Upper Hutt explosion, who died in the Wellington Public Hospital on Sunday night. Mr Virgil McGovern was a dentist, and a member of the Upper Hutt Town Board, and was one of the most popular young men in the district. When picked up after the explosion. Mr McGovern was at least sixty odd feet right opposite from the doorway of the building, in which the explosion took place, and from indications was not facing the burning building at the moment he had just turned away therefrom. On the Wednesday following the explosion was bright and cheerful, and was visited «by numerous friends. A week later he was suffering the result of a dangerous operation. He became totally unconscious, and in this state (practically) he remained until the end, twenty-eight days after the explosion. Mr McGovern was unmarried, and lived with his mother and sister at Upper Hutt. He was born at Kaitangata, and was 20 years of age. He came to Wellington in 1896 with his parents, who for a time kept the White Swan Afterwards, he lived at Taita, Kaiwarra, and Wallaceville, where his parents Hotel. purchased and conducted the Trentham Hotel. He was a pupil of the Marist Brothers School, and subsequently went to St. Patrick's College. He was engaged in the grain business at Waimate for a while. In this district his uncle, the well-known owner of racehorses, resided. On March 25 he was fleeted to the Upper Hutt Town Board, but he did not live to take his seat. When searched, five shillings were found on him and this amount was missed from the till. He previously appeared to have no money, his drinks having been paid for by others. The prisoner said he could, if he were allowed time, procure good character from his late employer, who lived on the other side of Napier, but the Magistrate thought the suggestion and the situation were rather remote, and that the theft had been proved. He therefore sentenced prisoner to three months hard labour. Thomas Brown, who was described as the chum of Daniel, was charged with stealing a bottle of porter from the bar of the same hotel. Mrs Elliot had informed Moss, the barman, that the prisoner was sitting in front of the hotel with a bottle of porter in his hands and Moss found him there playing with it, he had not bought a bottle of porter, and he was given in charge. Cross examined by Mr Allan, A man named Jackman said the driver of Mr Waterhouse's waggon told him that he had lost a case of shot, caps, locks, and chains; prisoner was drunk all that week, he was not positive about the day on which prisoner mentioned the case to him, but he did not think it was on Tuesday. Louis Thompson, carrier at Greytown, said that the day before his arrest the prisoner offered to sell him some cart chains. Liquor for a Friend - May a Border at a Hotel buys it - May boarder buy liquor for a friend: during the hours when licensed premises are closed. If it can be proved that such friend has not come upon the premises for the express purpose of obtaining liquor a boarder may purchase and supply a friend, but not otherwise in a case heard before Mr C R Orr Walker, SM, at Upper Hutt yesterday. Myra Naylor, who was defended by Mr H F O'Leary, failed to satisfy the Magistrate that a boarder named Scott, who had purchased liquor for a man named Keys on a recent Sunday morning, had a legal right so to do, and as Mrs Naylor, wife of the licensee, was charged with aiding and abetting in the commission of an offence, she was fined £2 and 16s costs. The peculiarity of this offence is that Mrs Naylor could not be convicted of selling to Scott, who as a boarder has a right to be supplied with liquor, yet by aiding and abetting Scott in supplying a friend she was guilty. Charges of selling after hours against Mrs Naylor and opening after hours and exposing liquor for sale against the licensee, L M Naylor, were all dismissed, it being held that the exposing of liquor for sale to a boarder was not exposing for, sale to other persons though others might be present.

Right of Entry An Interesting Point – An interesting point in the Licensing law was discussed at the Petone Magistrates Court this morning. Hilda Ellen Nickolls licensee of the Quinn's Post Hotel Trentham was charged with delaying to give admission to the Police when admission was demanded. Senior Sergeant McKelvey said that he went to the front door and knocked. The Licensee raised an adjoining window and when admission was demanded the window was shut and admission delayed for 8 or 10 minutes. Constables Macnamara and Wallace gave corroborative evidence. The defence raised by Mr J J McGraith was that the police had no right of entry unless; they had reasonable grounds for believing that a breach of the Act was being committed and quoted decisions to that effect. #A Licensing Case - Seldom is a case before the Courts in which a licensee is called to answer a breach of the Licensing Act but the question of the responsibility of a licensee for the acts of his servants is raised. On Sunday, 13th November, Senior-Sergeant McKelvie, of Petone, accompanied by Sergeant Reid and Constable Frost, of Lower Hutt, made a raid on the Quinn's Post Hotel at Trentham. No sooner was the presence of the police discovered than three seamen who were then quartered in the military camp made a hurried exit from the bar through a front window. As a result of the raid, Mrs H B Nickolls, licensee of the hotel, appeared at the Petone Magistrate's Court yesterday on charges of opening her hotel for the sale of liquor, and of exposing liquor for sale when the premises should have been closed. Mr J J McGrath, who appeared for the defendant, besides submitting that there was not sufficient proof that liquor had been exposed for sale, contended that, although a licensee was responsible for the acts of his servants in the case of liquor being sold, he was not responsible if, without his knowledge or authority, his servants should expose liquor for sale or open the premises for the sale of liquor. #Sunday Trading - Licensee and Barman Fined - At the Lower Hutt Court yesterday reserved judgment, was delivered by Mr J H Salmon, SM, in the case heard at Petone on 12th December, when Mrs H E Nicholls, licensee of the Quinn's Post Hotel, Trentham, was charged with opening the hotel for the sale of liquor on a Sunday, and, together with a barman, Guest, was also charged with exposing liquor for sale on the same day. The facts as submitted by the prosecution were admitted, but the defence was raised that the licensee was not responsible for the act of a servant in opening the premises or exposing liquor for sale without the licensee's authority. The Magistrate did not agree with that contention, for decided cases showed that while a licensee may not be responsible for the unlawful acts of a servant acting outside the scope of his duties, nor for the unlawful acts of any person other than a servant, he was responsible for the unlawful acts of a batman in opening the premises or exposing liquor for sale, since the barman stood in the place of the licensee in respect to the gale of liquor. Hence it would appear that the licensee was responsible for the acts of the barman, even when the latter was acting in disobedience of instructions. circumstances of the present case the barman might also have been charged with opening for sale. On the joint charge, Nicholls and Guest were fined £10 and £5 respectively. #After Hours Trading - Case at Trentham - Barman Convicted - A licensing case heard before Mr T B McNeil, SM, in the Magistrate's Court at Upper Hutt yesterday was that in which Joseph Quinn, licensee of the Quinn's Post (Trentham) Hotel, was charged with opening the premises for the sale of liquor after hours, allowing liquor to be consumed on the premises after hours, exposing liquor for sale after hours, and selling liquor after hours. There were similar charges against the barman Torrens McFetridge. Mr J Scott, on behalf of the licensee, entered pleas of not guilty to all four charges, and for McFetridge, also formally pleaded not The charges against both men were heard together. Constables C Joss and C Stewart stated that at 4.20 pm on Sunday, 08th September, they visited the Trentham Hotel, and went in by the front door and by a passage into the main bar. Part of the bar was open, giving a clear view of McFetridge inside, and of liquor on the shelves. On the bar counter were three bottles containing beer, stout, and lemonade respectively, and eight glasses, some containing liquor, and some showing signs of recent use. Eight men were standing around the bar. The Police asked for the licensee, and the barman said he was upstairs in bed, and that he had obtained the keys of the bar from the licensee to supply boarders. The licensee was found to be in bed suffering from a cold, and he admitted giving the keys to the barman. The barman said he opened the bar to serve three boarders, and while they were drinking several strangers came in, and then the police arrived. Mr Scott said there was no doubt that McFetridge had offended, and he withdrew the pleas of not guilty on his behalf. Mr Scott submitted that Quinn was in a different position. Quinn and his wife were the only ones to have the keys of the bar. That day there were two boarders in the house, and when McFetridge asked him for the keys he handed them over on the understanding that McFetridge was to supply only boarders. While the liquor was being supplied to them the other men came in and were served. The measure of Quinn's liability was the authority he gave to the barman. Mr Scott submitted that it was only a limited authority to sell to boarders. Before any conviction could be entered it must be proved that McFetridge had acted with the knowledge and authority of Quinn. Joseph Quinn, in evidence, said that McFetridge was in the bar from 9 o'clock to 6 o'clock every day, besides assisting to clean it out in the mornings. M'Fetridge was a young man, aged 21, who had been at the hotel since April, having had no previous hotel experience. He had never supplied any liquor after closing hours and had no keys to the bar. Quinn said that on the 08th September he was in bed all day with influenza. In the afternoon McFetridge asked for the keys of the bar, naming one of the boarders who wanted a drink. He handed over the keys and the police came in soon afterwards. He had no knowledge of what was going on, thinking that only the one boarder was being served. He had given McFetridge no authority for what, he had done. Corroborative evidence was given by McFetridge. The Magistrate decided to dismiss the information's against the licensee, although the circumstances were highly suspicious against him. The barman he convicted and fined £5 for selling after hours, the police with drawing the other charges. Andrew Sharp,

George O'Keefe, Henry Clayton, Matthew Reid, and Stanley John William Malone, men who were, found in the bar were, fined £1 each on charges of being found on licensed premises after hours. Two of the men found in the bar, William John Paul and Raymond Samuel George Benge, were fined £2 each, as this was their second offence of being found illegally on licensed premises reference Papers past website Evening Post newspaper 10 October 1929 page 23

Terrence McFetridge, barman at the Trentham Hotel, was charged with having sold liquor, opened for the sale of liquor, and exposed liquor for sale, all after hours, and similar charged were made against the licensee, Joseph Quinn. Mr J Scott appeared for all the defendants and pleaded not guilty to all the charges. Sergeant J W McHolm prosecuted. Constable Joss stated that with Constable Stewart he visited the Trentham Hotel about 10 am on Sunday, 22nd June, and in a small room next to the bar he found Kelly arid three boarders. Kelly admitted having come for a drink, but denied having had any. In his pockets were a bottle of stout and a bottle of beer, which he said he had just picked up in a paddock behind the hotel, where he had planted them the previous night. Mr Scott altered his plea in this case to guilty, and Kelly was convicted and fined £2. The same, evidence was used against McFetridge and Quinn. Constable Joss added that McFetridge admitted having served the boarders, but denied having supplied any to Kelly. Quinn was not on the premises at the time. Constable Stewart's evidence supported this. Mr Scott's submission that there was no case to answer was ruled out by the Magistrate, and the case proceeded. The defence raised by Mr Scott was that McFetridge had no authority to supply liquor to anyone during Quinn's absence after hours. On this morning Quinn, before going to church, had opened the bar for McFetridge to scrub it out and for that purpose only. Mr Scott quoted numerous cases, relating mainly to the liability of a licensee for the acts of his servant. Evidence was given by the three defendants, and by J S Cunningham and P O'Connor, two of the boarders. The barman must be convicted of opening for sale. I am unable to believe his story, said the Magistrate. A fine of £5 was imposed and the two other charges against McFetridge were withdrawn. Regarding Quinn, there was a doubt in the Magistrate's mind whether he could be convicted for an act of his servant. Mr Woodward said he would give a reserved decision in Wellington reference Papers past website Evening Post newspaper 14 August 1930 page 11 #Liquor After Hours - Inquire made by the police alter a fatal accident in Petone last year led to Joseph Quinn, licensee of Quinn's Post Hotel, and Terence McFetridge a barman, being charged with breaches of the Licensing Act in the Magistrate's Court to-day. Quinn was charged with selling liquor after hours and McFetridge with supplying after hours. The inquiries showed, said Senior Sergeant Edwards that the driver and some of the passengers of the car had had liquor at the hotel prior to the accident, having been supplied by McFetridge. They had also bought some bottled beer. Both the accused had had two previous convictions?. A plea of guilty was entered by Mr T A Scott, who appeared for both the defendants. Both Mr and Mrs Quinn, counsel said, had been in the hotel all the night, and they knew nothing about the offence. That there was an unfortunate ending was not a fact to be taken into consideration in dealing with the licensing case, and the plain fact of the matter was that the barman had exceeded his duty. The keys were evidently brought bock and put under witness's pillow, for they were there in the morning. Mrs Walsh told witness next morning that she had served some people the night before. Mrs Walsh said that the licensee had no knowledge that she was serving people in the bar that, night. She had no authority to serve people, having on one occasion been told by the police not to serve in the bar. #Obituary Mr Charles Edward Short - The death took place tit an early hour this morning of Mr Charles Edward Shortt, one of the best known and esteemed resident's oi Palmerston North. The deceased gentleman had been in a serious state of ill-health for some time past and recently underwent an operation for an internal complaint. On Monday evening Mr Shortt became unconscious and he passed away at 5 o'clock this morning. Born in London in 1848, Mr Shortt was in his 74th year. He was the youngest child of the late Mr Francis Jonathan Shortt banker, of the great metropolis, and was educated at a boarding school in London. His school days over, he entered the counting house of Messrs Howard Wvse, Son and Company, and there he remained until he left tor New Zealand with his wife and three children on the "Scottish Prince" in 1881, Mr Shortt having been married to Miss Harriet Emily Sleighmacher in 1872. After residing in Wellington lot several years, the family removed to Palmerston North, Mr Shortt having been appointed accountant to the firm of Messrs Joseph Nathan and Company whose establishment was then known as the Ready Money Store. A breakdown in health in 1800 necessitated Mr Shortt resigning this position and giving up accountancy. When the present public library was inaugurated in 1900, he was appointed librarian, and remained in the service of the Borough Council in this respect until his death. Mr Shortt had also discharged the duties of Registrar of Births, Death, and Marriages since 1910 and of Registrar of Electors since 1901, resigning the latter position a few days ago. In all these offices the deceased gentleman was courteous and obliging and he earned the respect and esteem of all with whom he came into contact. Mr Shortt's first wife died in 1902 and in 1916 he married Miss May Stanton, youngest daughter of the late Mr and Mrs John Stanton, of Petone. He leaves five children - Messrs C A Shortt of Te Aroha, F N Shortt of Foxton, L J E Shortt of Napier, Mrs Perrean of Christchurch and Miss Shortt of Palmerston North, in addition to his second wife, to all of whom the sympathy of a wide circle of friends will be extended in their sad bereavement. The late Mr W F Shortt, auctioneer, of Wellington, and the late Mr Francis Shortt of Auckland, were brothers of deceased, and his only other surviving near relatives are two widowed sisters residing at Wallington Surrey England.
