In 2019 the CBD Towers was situated at 84 – 88 Main Street Upper Hutt. It was formerly known as Astral Towers but was renamed CBD Towers in 2004.

The Architect G J Burn and Associates in conjunction with De Terte and Kerr-Hislop designed Astral Towers and presented the plans in 1973. The land was cleared and construction on Astral Towers began in 1974 on land that was once occupied by the former Hercock Brothers Grocery Store building. After the Store closed in June 1971 the former building was occupied by various businesses. The building was demolished and Astral Towers was built on the land.

Description A greyscale image was printed in the Upper Hutt Leader on 15 December 15 1981. There was a threat of a forced sale reported in the 24 February 1981 Leader in December the first mortgagee, the Perpetual Trustees Estate and Agency Company had successfully applied for a sale, to recover overdue payment, which had been due two-and-a-half years earlier. The Commercial Bank of Australia held a second mortgage. The owners were listed as Bernard Frederick Joe Feickert a local estate agent, Robert Huia and Violet Dawn Feickert of Kawerau. Perpetual Trustees bought the building for \$755 000 the next day. Auckland's National Towers Trust bought it in December 1981 for \$860,000, Upper Hutt's Slater Wilmshurst had been appointed managers, and were to hasted \$100,000 plus improvements; partly fire safety, and partly to improve security for the penthouse Tararua Lounge security by making it possible to isolate it from the office floors. The Lodge had advertised itself as a new concept for private functions, with skyline views, in a 10 July 1979 advertisement, and earlier on 21 November 1978. The building was renamed CBD Towers in 2004 refurbishment began in August and was completed late in 2005. Date taken December 1981 for \$860,000. Place Astral Towers, later CBD Towers.


Astral Towers - Built on the site of Hercock Bros. grocery. Hercock Bros closed at the end of June 1971; the Leader of 24 October 1973, in an article showing the site cleared for what would become the Astral Towers building, said the building had been burnt down. There was a threat of a forced sale reported in the 24 February 1981 Leader; in December the first mortgagee, the Perpetual Trustees Estate and Agency Company had successfully applied for a sale, to recover overdue payment, which had been due two-and-a-half years earlier. The Commercial Bank of Australia held a second mortgage. The owners were listed as Bernard Frederick (Joe) Feickert, a local estate agent, Robert Huia and Violet Dawn Feickert, of Kawerau. Perpetual Trustees bought the building for \$755 000 the next day. Astral Tower's topping off was reported in the 22 October 1975 Leader, with a view of Main Street taken from the top floor. The building was renamed CBD Towers in 2004 refurbishment began in August and was completed late in 2005. Date taken mid-1975.

Before the land was cleared and the former buildings demolished in the first Hercock Store was occupied by Clarke's Agencies and the second Hercock Store was occupation by Steptoe & Son.

Leo and Zara Amelia Wolfsohn purchased Clarke Agencies in 1961. In 1961 the business was then situated in Queens Chambers. Later the business moved further south in Main Street opposite Princess Street. Around 1971 the business relocated into the former original Hercock's building.

Mr Clarke has sold his business Clarke Agencies, to Mr and Mrs Leo Wolfsohn of Te Marua, who will conduct it along the same lines as in the past. All existing travel and other agencies will be continued as at present. Mr Clarke, who has been closely associated with the development of the Upper Hutt Valley over the past eight years, has been given sends off over the past week by several organisations including Upper Hutt Chamber of Commerce. Upper Hutt Club and Red Cross Society. It is with a certain sadness that we leave the thriving Upper Hutt Valley, where we have made many grand friends, said Mr Clarke this week. However, we are going to a district with potential similar to the Valley and we will certainly look forward to welcoming our many Upper Hutt friends when they come holidaying in the sunny Gisborne district. Mr Clarke will leave for Gisborne early next week, his wife and family following during the May holidays. Mr and Mrs Clarke, senior, plan to reside in Christchurch. In 1973 Clarke's Agencies was the last business to occupy the former Hercock building. I do not know where Clarke's Agencies relocated to next but later they occupied part of the Benge Building on Main Street near Russell Street.

Charlie Clouston began demolishing the building around October 1973 and cleared the site to make way for the building of Astral Towers. This was the final ending to the history of the first Frank Frederick Hercock Store building






Upper Hutt Leader 14 September 1944

1939 – 1944 McDonald's Fruit Store – Mr McDonald

MacDonald's Fruit Store and Hercock Brothers' crockery and grocery opened on 01 August 1940. Hercocks closed in June 1971, Steptoe and Son, second-hand dealers moved in in November. By December 1973 the site had been cleared possibly after a fire. The business had started as F F Hercock and that name was on this building in an early photo, his first building had been on the fruit store site. The fruit store was previously Alexander's, and also housed a Floriste in 1948, this picture could be earlier or later (another copy of the print was dated 1947). From 1957 to 1964 these premises were the site of the "77" Coffee Lounge, which later relocated to Queen's Chambers 19 Main Road (now Main Street). The former site of both the Hercock's Brothers shop and MacDonald's Fruit Store is now the location of CBD Towers (formerly known as Astral Towers). Date taken c1947, former site of MacDonalds Fruit Store and Hercock's Brothers shop.

The new Hercock Store was opened in 1940 alongside their former General Store. The store building was later occupied by McDonald's Fruit Store.

# 1923-1940 F F Hercock General Store - Frank Frederick Hercock


In 1923 Frank Frederick Hercock settled in Upper Hutt, where he bought the general store run by Frederick Augustus Clifford. Frank worked in partnership with Walter Neil Clifford for three years, when Walter Clifford left to work back on his farm at Wallaceville.

Ten year earlier in 1913 Frank Frederick Hercock married Freda Mabel Clifford. Freda's father was Frederick Augustus Clifford. Freda's brother was Walter was Walter Neil Clifford. The business began as a family partnership until Frank became the sole owner of the business.

View of Main Street looking east from west of St Joseph's Church from opposite Gething's Motors site. Published in the Upper Hutt Leader, 11 August 2004, over the caption Main Street has changed a lot since this photo was taken. The Courthouse is in the right hand foreground and Hercock's store next door to where Astral Towers now is. This photograph was loaned by Margaret Robertson. It belonged to her mother-in-law, the late Margaret Robertson, a long-time Upper Hutt resident whose husband was Arthur. There are no clues as to the photographer but handwritten on the back is taken about 1929. It is likely to have been taken from the old St Joseph's Church bell tower. A note accompanying the image differs slightly from the caption, noting that the family say the photographer was local man Peter Beavis who took the photo from a pine tree that once stood in Pine Avenue. Otherwise it could have been taken from the old St Joseph's Church bell tower. Image P2-400-648 is from the same viewpoint. P Beavis definitely took a photo from here during the 1939 funeral of Mayor Peter Robertson. Further comment, the bell tower and pine tree were both too far back from Main Street, but there were suitable trees in Main Street, west of St Joseph's churchyard. Hercock's original general store, on the site of CBD Towers. On left behind are the Upper Hutt Printing building, advertising the Leader, which started in 1939 and signwriting on Benges Garage. On right is part of F F Hercock's (later Hercock Bros.) second shop, opened on 01 August 1940, which sold crockery and groceries. After Hercock's closed in June 1971, secondhand dealers moved in November. By December 1973 the site had been cleared, possibly after a fire. Power Chief was a petrol brand, "Never holds you up. Never lets you down." De Reszke (named after an operatic tenor) and Capstan were cigarette brands. The earlier dating (1912) may be wrong; but it might be the date of the first grocery. ## Upper Hutt Leader 08 October 1953

Death of Local Businessman - Mr F F Hercock - The death occurred on Monday of Mr Frank Frederick Hercock well-known business man in Upper Hutt for the past 30 years. Mr Hercock was well respected in the district and his death came as .a great shock, as only on Saturday last he was at the official opening the bowling season. Born in 1887 at Taueru near Masterton, he was the son of Mr and Mrs D Hercock, well known residents of the Wairarapa. Coming to Upper Hutt, Mr Hercock was first employed by Mr G L Lay storekeeper, whose shop was at the corner of Station Street and Main Road, where the present A & NZ Bank stands. Marrying a local girl, Miss F M Clifford in 1913, Mr Hercock went back to the Wairarapa again and worked for A H Herbert & Co., at Eketahuna, after which he became manager for that firm at Alfredton. In 1923 Mr Hercock returned to Upper Hutt, where he bought the general store run by Mr F A Clifford, in the shop now occupied by Mr Alexander Fruiterer and in partnership with Mr W N Clifford, carried on business for three years, when Mr Clifford left to work back on his farm at Wallaceville. During those days motor transport was in its infancy and Mr Hercock used to drive a horse and cart to deliver his orders. In 1939 Mr Hercock opened the present store next to the Courthouse, taking his two sons in with him, the latter having taken the running of the business over for the past few years. During his years of business Mr F Hercock built up a great name and the result can be seen today with its modern store, one of the first of its kind in the district. Outside of business, Mr Hercock was a keen follower of the local Rugby Club, being, a Vice-President since 1945, and could be seen every playing Saturday at Maidstone Park, or if the Seniors were playing away, there you would find him cheering the local team along. Probably he will be best remembered in sport by members of the Bowling Club, where he has been a most active member for having held the office of President of the Club, also Green Superintendent for several not to say the least he was a very fine bowler. His presence at the green will be felt immensely. He was a member of the Forrester's Lodge at Eketahuna also up to the time of his death was an Elder and Manager of St David's Presbyterian Church Upper Hutt. Mr Hercock leaves one daughter Lois (Mrs Hunter Wanganui), 3 sons, Keith, Dudley and Winstone (Auckland) to mourn his loss. Mrs Hercock (died) on 07 October 1947. Other near relatives are brothers of the late Mr Hercock, Mr T W Hercock and C C Hercock farmer Pahitua and Mr W N Clifford brother-in-law.



# 1940-1971 History of the second Hercock's building

Hercocks new grocery opened on 01 August 1940, and with the largest floor area in Upper Hutt, F F Hercock's grocery, sited to the left of this building, had been replaced by F F Hercock's (later Hercock Bros.) Crockery and Grocery, Astral Towers now on this site. The 1946 date originally quoted is wrong; this picture comes from Leo Morel's streetscape. This high-definition picture has been taken from a cropped print. Hercock Bros closed at the end of June 1971, the Leader of 24 October 1973, in an article showing the site cleared for what would become the Astral Towers building, said the building had been burnt down. The 28 November Leader said Steptoe and Son (second-hand dealers) had been there after Hercock's, they had opened in November 1971. This image is identified as R1 in Vin Benge's oral history interview about the Leo Morel photos of Main Street. Date taken Jan 1948.

Frank Frederick Hercock built the new Grocery store next to the former store. In Frank's obituary it stated that he opened the store in 1939 but it was actually opened on 01 August 1940.

Joining Frank in the new store was two of his sons Keith and Dudley Hercock. After Frank retired Keith and Dudley continued to operate the business under "*Hercock Bros*."

Local Upper Hutt residents would phone the Hercock shop, place a grocery order and later the order was delivered to their residence. Below is a copy of the Hercock Bros grocery order form
