BIRCHVILLE SCHOOL STORY

Birchville School was opened on 30 May 1978 with the official opening ceremony held the following year on 17 April 1979. The school's first principal was Thelma Riley. The foundation roll consisted of 130 pupils.

Birchville School is built on part section 173. Henry Gilbert was the original owner of Section No 173 and received the Crown Grant for the land in the 1856. The land was conveyed to the Benge family in 1872.

Dominion newspaper 07 February 1931

"Fairy Nightlight" writes: "there is a picnic place on the Akatarawa Road not very far from here. If you go there on a Sunday it crowded with cars. It is called the Birchville Estate because the trees that grow upon it are nearly all birches.

Upper Hutt Leader 27 August 1964

School for Birchville – The Hutt County Council has been advised by the Ministry of Works that negotiations are being conducted for the purchase of a five acre block at Birchville as a site for a school. It is not expected that construction of the school would begin for approximately two years. The site has a frontage to an unformed road and the County was asked to confirm that it would undertake the construction of the road to provide access to the school. However the County will not be responsible for the formation of the road as the proposal involved a subdivision. In those circumstances the onus would be on the sub-divider to form the road. (Reference Upper Hutt City Library Heritage collection UH Leader newspaper 27 August 1964 Volume XXI Number 32)

Although in 1964 negotiations began to establish a school in Birchville it would take another 15 years before a school was built in the Birchville district of Akatarawa.

1978-1988 (01 to 10 years)

Birchville School opened in 30 May 1978. The opening ceremony was held the following year on 07 April 1979. Ron Bailey MP for Heretaunga officially opened Birchville School. Thelma Riley was principal, followed by Brian Sutherland, Andy Lovell and Maureen Scott. D Constable was

acting principal at the start of 1991. The school was in a new subdivision between Te Marua and Akatarawa, but drew on old residential areas as well. The founding roll of 130 peaked at over 200 before coming back to 162.

Places of Interest

Akatarawa cemetery is situated on Akatarawa Road. In 1896 Samuel William Benge donated the land for the cemetery. The first burial was for Jacob C Cruywagen in December 1896. A later burial was Oscar Poulson who was buried in 1903. The 1905 cemetery Trustees were J Whiteman, J W Cudby, J A Hazelwood and J B Dalton.

Akatarawa Scout Hall is situated in Black Beech Street Birchville. The hall occupies park of Hoggard Park.

Birchville Dam is believed to be the second unreinforced concrete arch dam built for water supply in New Zealand. It was built in 1930 for the Upper Hutt Borough Council to provide increased water capacity for the borough and replaced a water supply weir built in 1913-1914 at the same location on Clarke's Creek near Birchville. Decommissioned in 1958 when Upper Hutt joined the Wellington regional water scheme this dam is now an historic attraction on the Cannon Point Walkway.

Birchville Substation - Hutt Valley Power Board

Benge Memorial Hall was formerly the Mungaroa School later renamed Te Marua School. Mungaroa School sometimes spelt Mangaroa and Maungaroa was built on part section 171 and opened on 03 April 1879. The first teacher was Mrs Eliza Rebecca Evans who retired on 31 March 1911 after 32 years at the same school. The first pupil to enrol at Mungaroa School was John Thomas BENGE (1870-1947). In 1913 Mungaroa school was renamed Te Marua School. In 1973 Te Marua School formerly Mungaroa School closed. The building was renamed the Benge Memorial Hall after the first school's pupil.

Harcourt Park is situated in Birchville. The site was used for the move "Lord of the Rings". The park caters for all ages with a playground, stage, sports fields, kids cycle track, disc golf, paddling pool and splash pad, botanical and native bush areas, community sport clubrooms, space to picnic and room to play. Close to Te Awa Kairang / Hutt River, Harcourt Holiday Park, the Hutt River Trail and Remutaka Cycle Trail.

Hoggard Park is situated off Akatarawa Road in the Birchville district. The park runs alongside of the Te Awa Kairangi / Hutt River with access at the end of Norbert Street on Black Beech Street. Hoggard was named after Noel Farr Hoggard (1913-1975) who was the editor of the Advocate weekly district newspaper.

Streets - Gemstone Drive in the Birchville district was named after the Gemstone. A gemstone is a piece of mineral crystal which in cut and polished form is used to make jewellery or other adornments. Gemstones and Crystals were the theme for streets in the Birchville subdivision which was based on the geological feature of Emerald Hill.

The Akatarawa Dairy and Convenience Store at 115 Akatarawa Road in Birchville has had many owners over the years. Robert John & Zillah Christina Dalton established the store date unknown but where serving customers in 1954. Brian Frederick Charles & Vera Hazel Rabbitt took over the store in 1957 and worked there for 26 years. The store is still operating today. (Reference Upper Hutt – The History by J A Kelleher 1991 page 184-187)

The Private hospital owned and operated circa 1892 by Ruby and William Clark was once situated at 12 Bridge Road now numbered 55 Bridge Road in Birchville. Folk lore records that the house was used for unmarried mothers and also a children's foster home referred to by early Government records as a receiving home. Ten children are known to have been fostered by the Clark family. Part of Bridge road was previously known as Reid Road after the saw-miller Donald Reid.

The Tea Shelter (kiosk / rotunda) is situated in Akatarawa Road Birchville. The shelter was erected by the Tea Bureau (NZ) Company and donated to the Ministry of Works. The official handing over ceremony was held on Saturday 10 December 1949. In 2023 the building was still standing on the same site as it had done for the last 74 years.
