# Dame School Trentham - 1850s

Around the 1850s in the Trentham district a Dame school was established by Mrs Hannah Barton the wife of Richard Barton. The teacher at the Dame School was Miss Hannah Hedge.

## Evening Post newspaper 13 April 1935

In an introduction written by the Mayor of Upper Hutt (Mr A J McCurdy) it is stated that in the fifties and early sixties people were too busy establishing themselves on their holdings to do much of a community character and beyond spasmodic attempts by way of home study and night classes and a <a href="Dame school established">Dame school established</a> by Mrs Hannah Barton at Trentham with Miss Hannah Hedge as teacher nothing was done locally for the education of the rising generation. Those who could be spared and whose people could arrange their boarding out were sent to school in one or other of the older settlements on the shores of Port Nicholson. It was not until 1864 that a successful attempt was made to establish a public school in the new settlement.

In the 1850's a Mrs Hannah BARTON and Miss Hannah HEDGE operated a <u>Dame school</u> in Trentham. All over the Hutt Valley other little schools operated in small buildings which often doubled for other purposes such as church services. As early as 1857 and thought to be the first in the Wellington area a school was established in Wainuiomata. (An early classroom serves as their Historical Society's Museum to this day.)
