### MANGAROA SCHOOL STORY

Mrs Bertha Christina Seeds Private Mangaroa School was opened on Monday 04<sup>th</sup> May 1914. This private school was situated in Maclaren Street in the former May Morn sawmill building in the Mangaroa Valley. Mrs Seed's husband was the manager of the May Morn Mill.

## Dominion newspaper 06 September 1913

The management of the May morn Estate Mungaroa have arranged a special trip for to-day when visitors from town and elsewhere will be given an insight under the direction of Mr Arthur Seed (the newly appointed manager) of the works undertaken by an English syndicate in that locality.

A few years later a new Mangaroa School was built in Flux Road in the Mangaroa Valley and official opened on September 1920.

The Mangaroa School in the Mangaroa Valley should not be confused with the old Mungaroa School in Te Marua. The old Mungaroa School in Te Marua was often spelt Mangaroa and/or Maungaroa in records and newspapers. The Mungaroa School committee requested that the school name be changed to Te Marua School and this eventually happened in 1913. This was to stop the confusion with Mrs Seed's Private Mangaroa School.

#### Evening Post newspaper 29 January 1913

The Mungaroa School Committee wrote to the board with regard to changing the name of the school. On being questioned as to the reason for the proposed change the secretary stated that the committee wished to change the name of the school to Te Marua owing to the confusion which arose through similarity of the existing name with another place. Mr Stewart stated that he had written asking if the proposed new name was an "official" one in any way and pointing out that it was usual to name a school after the name of the nearest post office. He added that at present he had to address letters for Mungaroa to Upper Hutt. (The matter was held over to a later meeting)

NOTE - although the old Mungaroa School changed its name to Te Marua many newspaper articles continued referring to the school as the Mungaroa, Mangaroa and/or Maungaroa.

Evening Post newspaper 28 October 1913

A Schoolhouse of canvas was the expedient suggested by Mr J G W Aitken at the Education Board meeting to-day to meet the case of Mangaroa from which settlement a protest was received against the delay in providing for the education of the children in the district. The local residents had asked for a satisfactory train service for the conveyance of the children to Upper Hutt but this the Railway Department had declined to arrange for. As alternative members of the board suggested that a School might be established at Mangaroa which was likely to have an increase in population if the May Morn timber industry were established. Sir Walter Buchanan questioned whether such additional settlement would be permanent. The Chairman (Mr JR Lee) mentioned that in some parts of Australia there were moveable schools which could be easily taken to pieces in one locality and set up again at the other end of the country. It was then that Mr Aitken suggested that a tent should be utilised. It has been done in Auckland commented the Chairman and Mr A W Hogg agreeing said I saw it in Taranaki a number of years ago. The whole matter was referred to the executive for consideration which body will first of all endeavour to persuade the Department to improve the train service to Upper Hutt.

# 1914-1924 (01 to 10 years)

Mrs Bertha Christina Seed opened the Private Mangaroa School on 04 May 1914. Her husband was Arthur James Seed a manager of May Morn Mills in the Mangaroa / Maymorn district.

His wife (Arthur Seed) the former Bertha Aldrich started a private school in her home, for a daughter and some neighbours. Arthur's representations to the Wellington Education Board obtained regular schooling, in 1914 in an old mill building in McLaren Street (Arthur Seed was commissioner, and had a board of house-holders representatives), in 1920 at the present Flux Road sit.

### Hutt Valley Independent newspaper 29 May 1915

Mrs Arthur Seed promised the bairns of May Morn school that if they brought pennies to buy a doll to sell for the Wounded Soldiers Fund she would add a penny to every one of theirs. The little folk mustered up 12s making (with Mrs Seed's subsidy) a sum in pence which is "Really two gross".

May Morn entries were due to the encouragement of Mrs Arthur Seed (formerly a teacher) who resides there and is a Vice President of the Society.

### Hutt Valley Independent newspaper 23 December 1916

May Morn school break up was celebrated by a social gathering of all hands in the valley and a very pleasant evening resulted winding up with cheers for the teacher (Miss Gunn)and singing the National Anthem. Clarice Jenner was top in the First Division while Marjory Seed and Fred Edwards tied for top place in the Second Division. Last week information was supplied us that Upper Hutt scholars had not competed in a local writing competition and after we had printed a number of copies we were told that some had competed but without success and we altered the wording in the remainder of the issue. On further enquiry we find our original informant inadvertently used the word "writing" for "sewing" which makes all the difference in the world. We are indebted to Mrs Seed for clearing up the matter. The May Morn school roll has dropped to 16 and of these there were six eligible for entry in the sewing competitions all entered and secured eight prizes for their exhibits. On asking Upper Hutt children why they had not competed for the sewing prizes Mrs Seed was informed they never heard a word about sewing only writing.

Opening of Mungaroa School – The new Mungaroa School in the Mungaroa Valley was opened with interesting ceremony on Saturday afternoon a party of educationists including the minister of

Education (Hon O J Parr) taking part in the proceedings. The new school occupies a prominent position in spacious grounds. The Minister introduced by Mr W H Field, MP, formally declared the school opened and an adjournment followed to the interior, where refreshments were served. The arrangements were in the hands of a most capable committee, the chairman being Mr Edwards. Mr Maher presided over the proceedings and spoke in defence of education for the farmers who he said should be intelligent and resourceful. In a better instructed people he added, would be found a corrective to the work of designing people who could only impose on the credulous. The Minister of Education said the chairman had struck the right note in his reference to education. He had a particular interest in country schools and would be found a champion of school committees. There was a difficulty in Meeting the requirements of the people for schools because of the cost of school buildings but he felt sure the neglect of the national asset of education could not be justified on the score of expense. Mr Parr spoke at length on the aims of education to a highly appreciative audience and before concluding and in deference to the wish of the audience, unveiled a memorial to the young men of the district who took part in the war. It was slated that thirty young men had been its contribution and that a third of the number had mode the sacrifice of their lives on the altar of duty. The Minister said it was a great record from so small a community. The chairman of the Education Board (Mr T Forsyth) Messrs London, Rishworth, Field, MP, and Clifford also spoke and the proceedings were brought to a close by the singing of the National Anthem.



She was taken to hospital by the Free Ambulance and last night her condition was critical but this morning although still serious it had improved.



#### Upper Hutt Leader newspaper 02 November 1944

Mangaroa School - A large number of parents and friends of the pupils of the Mangaroa School attended the initial Calf-judging Day of the Mangaroa Branch of the Hutt Valley Boys and Girls Agricultural Club held in the school grounds on the morning of Friday 20th October. Mr H Scholes on behalf of the School extended a Welcome to the visitors, and expressed his thanks to Mr J Horn of Ohau for his services as judge. Mr J J Stevenson Agriculture Inspector to the Wellington Education Board district after endorsing the remarks of the previous speaker paid a tribute to Mr Scholes and his committee for their help and co-operation which had contributed greatly to the success of the Branch's first year's work. Mr Robinson Hutt-Horowhenua representative on the Wellington Education Board gave a brief outline of the aim of the calf rearing competition and the progress made in this activity throughout the Wellington. He then

congratulated the pupils on their record number of ten entries from a school whose total roll number was only 22.

The prize-winners were (a) Seniors (7 entries), Care and Attention, Gordon Scholes Maigpie 1 - Ailsa Lindsay's Janet 2 - Ben Jagger's Minnie 3 (b) Juniors (3 entries) Care and Attention, Beverley Whiteman's Joan 1 - Mervyn Scholes Rewa 2 - Allan Benge's Vera 3 (c) Best Dairy Type, Ngaire Whiteman's June 1.

After the ribbons and medals had been presented by the Wife of the Chairman of the School Committee Mrs H Scholes, Mr Horn outlined the chief points looked for in good dairy cattle. He also complimented the entrants on their work and gave them some helpful hints on calf rearing in general. Morning tea served in the schoolroom under the auspices of the lady members of the School Committee brought the function to a very happy conclusion.

At present 39 children and two teachers are in one small classroom at Mangaroa and urgent relief is immediately required.

Extra Accommodation at Mangaroa School - Last Wednesday 01 March 1 the chairman of the Wellington Education Board Mr N Seddon and the two ward members Messrs Guy and Robinson in conjunction with the Board's Secretary and Architect visited the Mangaroa School, the request of the School Committee who wished to discuss several problems for the benefit of the pupils and the school. The chairman of the Mangaroa School Committee and other members placed their requests before the Board's representatives stating that the most urgent was that of accommodation. Other matters discussed were sanitation, water supply, residence for Headmaster, and a hard surface playing area. Mr Seddon promised the committee on behalf of the Board that standard size pre-fabricated classroom would be erected on the school ground and that it would be ready for use by the next school term. He stated they all realized the urgent need for additional accommodation to cater for the ever increasing number of children that were being enrolled at the Mangaroa School. The question of additions to the present school would be considered by the Board as soon as the full requirements were known. Mr Seddon said the Board would be recommended to make an urgent application to the Department for a grant to lay on a water supply and also to install modern sanitary conveniences at the school. The position of the Headmaster having to travel to and from the school daily would also be a further recommendation by the Board to the Department for a grant to build a suitable residence. Concluding the chairman told the School Committee that if they would forward their requirements as regards hard surfacing he was sure the Board would assist them in that matter. In thanking the chairman of the Education Board and the ward members for visiting the school, the School Committee expressed their satisfaction at the assurance of additional accommodation promised before the beginning of next term stated the chairman of the School Committee.

In 1950 children arrived with their parents and settling into the Public Works and Railway Maymorn Camp in Mangaroa. The men were working on the Remutaka Deviation and tunnel. The children's arrival put pressure on the facilities at the Mangaroa School. It would be a few more years before a new school was established in the Maymorn Camp so an addition to the school was urgently required along with all the other problems.

### Upper Hutt Leader newspaper 08 June 1950

Mangaroa Tunnel - On Saturday 03 June at the request of a large number of parents of children at the Railway Tunnel Camp, Mr A E Robinson member of the Wellington Education Board met the parents at the Camp to discuss the Educational facilities for the children in that area. Robinson stated that provision for the education of the children was being made at the Mangaroa School. A new class-room was being erected, new sanitary conveniences and a good supply of water was being laid on. The matter of transport for the children until the possibility of erecting a new school to serve the children in the Camp could be investigated was also discussed. Mr Robinson answered a number of questions and advised the parents that the requests for transport and school accommodation at the Camp would have to be made in writing to the Wellington Education Board who would have a survey made of the position. A hearty vote of thanks was accorded the member of the Board for his address for visiting the Camp and advising the parents of the position in regard to provision of education for their children. New School for Mangaroa PWD - The Education Department favours the establishment of a school at the Ministry of Works Camp at Mangaroa, rather than transporting the children to the present Mangaroa School. The Wellington Education Board are to obtain the price of a two roomed prefabricated building plus laboratories and submit details to the Department. The Department are of the opinion that if future numbers warrant provision of three rooms at the camp, they favour the removing and re-erecting of the pre-fab building now at Mangaroa School. Mr A E Robinson the district representative has been working hard for such a school and his representations have at last borne fruit. The extra pre-fab rooms at the Upper Hutt School will be ready for the re-opening of the new term next month. Trentham School's extra rooms will not be available for the time being as the builder is at present held up for Pinex Hard Board. Lost In Bush - Last week several parents of children attending Upper Hutt Primary School were getting anxious when they found their offspring had not arrived home from a trip to the bush at Mangaroa with their schoolteacher. When it became dark the police were contacted and a search party organised and with the aid of torches both the teacher and, the children were found. It seemed that the path leading out had been missed but at the same time all were within easy reach of the roadway. One girl in giving her experience stated that 19 children had started off with the teacher on Easter Tuesday morning for a trek to the bush and after exploring certain parts had lunch after which further parts were explored. After a time it was decided to make tracks for home and that was when they became bushed. The children did not get panicky as the teacher kept them under control but their thoughts were they would have to wait until daylight to see the way out. Great was the relief when we were found said this schoolgirl and it was not long after we were on the way home to Mum and Dad.

Mangaroa School Celebrates Its First Fifty Years - Mangaroa School celebrated a big occasion last weekend when more than 150 ex-pupils and former teachers returned to attend the Golden

Jubilee of their old school. The celebrations included a Maori concert held in the Maymorn hall on the Friday night a formal opening and roll call at the school on Saturday afternoon, a cocktail party and dinner held in the Rugby gymnasium on Saturday night and a church service conducted by the Rev. Lance Robinson at the school on Sunday morning.

Small in size but large in life of the community it serves Mangaroa School epitomised friendly country informality on Saturday afternoon. Snug within a tall shelter-belt of evergreen trees against a magnificent mountain backdrop the school buildings and playgrounds provided a pleasantly intimate setting for the opening ceremony and roll call.

500 PUPILS – "We are delighted with the response to our invitations to attend this reunion it is most gratifying to see so many present," said the chairman of the school committee Mr T L Macnab in a welcoming speech on behalf of the Jubilee Committee. "In the whole of the 50 years we have had only 500 pupils through the school. Of this number 74 were the children of Air Force personnel during the war years." Those who attended the school at its opening in 1914 saw the end of the sawmilling era and the beginning of farming said Mr Macnab. "The valley has changed little in those 50 years the same houses are here and very few new ones built. But things are changing now and the next 25 years will see enormous development. By the time we celebrate our 75th Jubilee I think that the expected progress will have absorbed us into the sphere of influence) of the greater Wellington expansion.

COUNTY GIFT - Mr R O Kimmins a resident farmer and chairman of the Hutt County Council brought greetings and congratulations from his council. It is quite an achievement for so small a school to reach its Golden Jubilee being so close to a big centre, he said. "Mangaroa School has certainly been a focal point in this farming community. I'm not an ex pupil but I've worked with many of them and count it a privilege to have been associated with the projects of the school, said Mr Kimmins who then handed over a cheque for £20 a gift from the County Council to help pay for recently acquired sports equipment. Mr Dalmer of the Education Board congratulated all concerned with the Jubilee Celebrations and spoke briefly on the alms of education after which he formally declared the celebrations open. Many letters and telegram of good wishes and apologies for absence were read by the present headmaster Mr E Dewes. Sheafs of beautiful flowers were presented to Mrs Klmmins, Mrs Dalmer and Mrs McNab by three small pupils of the school, Elizabeth Lindsay, Sheryl Cowan and eight-year-old Allsa Gorrie, daughter of one of the first decade pupils Mr Len Gorrie.

ROLL CALL - Among those who answered the roll call were two first-day pupils Mrs Clarice Schlup (nee Jenner) who as oldest pupil present had the honour of ringing the school bell and her sister Mrs Doris Fox (nee Jenner). Those who answered the roll call for first decade pupils (1914-1924) were Mr Fred Edwards, Mr L Gorrie, Mrs Jessie Edwards (nee Whiteman), Mrs Hilda Davis (nee Gorrie), Mr Bob Whiteman, Mrs Ivy Barker (nee Collett), Mr Tom Burrell, Mrs May Morrison (nee Collett), Mr Ernie Gorrie, Mrs Rosa Hoare (nee Martin), Mr Ray Whiteman and Mrs Marjorie Connell (nee Seed). Former teachers who were present were Mrs G Mitcalfe (nee Hawthorn) and Miss M Admore.

ENTERTAINMENT - During the afternoon the assembly was entertained by pupils of the school who under the guidance of their headmaster Mr Dewes gave a delightful display of vaulting and tumbling. Later members of the Police Dog Unit from Trentham demonstrated their skill as dog trainers with a series of wonderful obedience tests which including scaling high walls and jumping through burning hoops. Those responsible for this fascinating display were Sergeant A Symes with Rex, Constable J McLean with Jeff and Constable M Cooke with Alec. An excellent commentary was provided by Constable T Penrose. It is certain that every farmer present envied these men their amazing control over their magnificent dogs. The serving of tea brought the afternoon's activities to a close.

In 1989 the 75<sup>th</sup> Jubilee of the Mangaroa School was celebrated and a publication was compiled by the Late Phyllis Macnab. The publication is available from the Upper Hutt City Library Heritage collection and has been scanned and on the Recollected website.

Mangaroa School rolls were affected by this valley's farming fortunes by RNZAF used of stores building and by railway construction jobs. A separate school served the Maymorn end of the valley during tunnel construction. The school has its basis in Mrs Bertha Seed's private school, first in a sawmill building in Mclaren Street where it opened with Mr Abraham as teacher on 04 May 1914. The school reopened on the Flux Road site in September 1920. In1991 the roll was 36. Mrs Phyllis Macnab (nee Scholes) wrote the school's history and remained an authority on old Mangaroa.

Places of Interest

**Wilfred Revelle Jackson** was a photographer who gifted his photographic collection to the Upper Hutt City and the images are available on the Upper Hutt City Recollect website. Revelle (1918-2015) resided at 5 Paton Street in Mangaroa.

**Mangaroa Dairy Factory** was once situated on 155 Mangaroa Hill Road in the Mangaroa Valley Upper Hutt. The site is now occupied by the Wellington Vintage Machinery Club.

**Mangaroa old Railway station** and railway line (1876). The loading platform is still visible in Flux Road and there is a plaque marking the spot.

Mangaroa Post Office shed was once situated in Flux Road.

**Maymorn Public Works and Railway Camp** were once situated off Parks Line Road and part of Old School Road. The camp provided housing for the men working on the Remutaka tunnel and their families. There were also single men guarters provided for the tunnellers.

**Maymorn School** was opened 1951 and closed 1967. The school was established for the children living in the Maymorn Public Works and Railway Camp.

Maymorn Railway Station was established when the new Remutaka deviation was completed.

May Morn Estate Company Limited referred to as the May morn sawmill had its own railway siding and was once situated at the end of Maclaren Street in Maymorn (Mungaroa Valley). Established in 1910 and closed at the beginning of WW1. It was owned by an English syndicate and when the money flow from England stopped during WW1 the results was the company been unable to pay their workers. The May Morn company developed Maclaren Street and Paton Street

**Native Reserves No 132** is off Parks Line Road and has a railway line running through the section. This Reserve requires some research when time permits. The section may have been leased to James Cruickshank. It is important that before I searched the Maori Land Court Minute Books I have to know the correct spelling of the name given to the reserve.

**Maman Te e Pa** - On the Upper Hutt survey map it records and area named "MAMAN TE E PA" which is situated on un-surveyed land west opposite Sections 114 & 115. This area is on the opposite side of McLaren Road off Parks Line Road in the Mangaroa Valley. (Reference Archives NZ Wellington R22824230 AAFV 997 box 120 W19 Upper Hutt District Sections and names of owners,

**Royal New Zealand Air force** base buildings were once situated in Flux Road and Parks Line Road. These buildings are now privately owned. The RNZAF housing was situated in Alamein Avenue and they are also now privately owned.

**Streets - Alamein Avenue** was named after the World War Two battle of El Alamein. The second Battle of El Alamein (23 Oct 1942 – 11 Nov 1942) was a decisive battle of the Second World War. The Royal New Zealand Air Force No 1 Base Supply Battalion built Defence stores and six Defence houses in Mangaroa Valley. The houses occupied Alamein Avenue which is situated between Flux and Parkes Line Roads. Further north down Parkes Line Road was the former World War One Maymorn Military camp. The camp site was previously the May Morn sawmill with its chimney and railway siding. The WWI camp site was chosen as the railway siding assisted in transporting men and equipment in and out of the area efficiently. A military theme was chosen by the Defence Department for the street.

**Streets - Flux Road** was named after Henry Pullen Flux. Henry (1850-1929) and wife Sarah Elizabeth Fleet (1855-1894) had 7 children. Henry Pullen Flux, a brick-maker, was residing in Mangaroa in the 1880 & 1890 Electoral Roll. There was a kiln near the Maymorn sawmill in Mangaroa making bricks. In the UHCC library picture the kiln is obscured by smoke from the train. The road was <u>not</u> named after George Flux (1851-1932) who was a schoolmaster at various schools in the Wellington district. Mangaroa School is situated in Flux Road.

Streets - Maclaren Street was named after Janette Paton Maclaren. Janette (nee Maclaren 1874-1916) was the wife of Howard Butters. Howard (1876-1916) was the managing director of the May Morn Estate in Mangaroa. The May Morn sawmill established at the end of Maclaren Street was owned by an English syndicate called the Maymorn Land Company. The 07 March 1913 New Zealand Herald newspaper read "Among the visitors to Wellington is Mr Howard Butters managing director of the May Morn Estate at Mungaroa. The English company has secured a block of land between Mungaroa and Otaki for the purpose of milling the timber". The family made a few trips to New Zealand before returning to England. The 29 March 1913 Hutt Valley Independent newspaper reads "Mr Howard Butters the new managing director of the May Morn Company interviewed the council and asked permission to run trains on the company's tramway and cross roads before daylight and after dark to convey workmen from the model village to the bush and back. Permission granted subject to council's solicitors certifying in order". The street was not named after the land agent John Ewen Maclaren of Main Road

Heretaunga. Due to many problems including the outbreak of WW1 the Company ceased. The May Morn Sawmill Company owned a Barclay O-4-4-4OT steam locomotive named 'Joan'.

**Streets - Mangaroa Hill Road** was named as it is the road that leads over the hill into the Mangaroa Valley. Mangaroa means *mang* (a small river or stream), *roa* (long). Mangaroa Hill Road was recorded in the Wises NZ Post Office Directory 1961-1962. The farmers in the valley for many years had to contend with early dirt road but eventually it was sealed making for an easier

**Streets - Parkes Line Road** was named after Robert Parks. Robert's (1812-1870) wife was Marion (nee Hart 1822-1891). Robert was an early New Zealand Company surveyor (1839) who cut survey lines across the valley: No 1 Silverstream, No 2 Trentham, and No 3 Wallaceville. He was the Town Surveyor in 1842 and later became Chief Surveyor to the Wellington Provincial Council. In 1882 tenders were called for felling bush on Parkes Line, Mungaroa Valley. The local deep creek swimming hole in the Mangaroa River was accessible from Parkes Line Road

**Streets - Paton Street** was named after Janette Paton Butters nee Maclaren. Janette (1874-1916) was the wife of Howard Butters. Howard (1876-1916) was the managing director of the May Morn Estate in Mungaroa. The May Morn sawmill established in 1912 at the end of Maclaren Street was owned by an English syndicate called the May Morn Land Company. This was a short lived company. The 07 March 1913 New Zealand Herald newspaper read "*Mr Howard Butters managing director of the May Morn Estate at Mungaroa*". The family made a few trips to New Zealand (two children were born in NZ) before returning to England. Wilfred Revelle Jackson a photographer gifted his photographic collection to the Upper Hutt City and the images are available on the Upper Hutt City Recollect website. Revelle (1918-2015) resided at 5 Paton Street in Mangaroa.

**Wellington Vintage Machinery Club** is situated at 155a Mangaroa Hill Road in the Mangaroa Valley Upper Hutt. The club occupies the land and buildings that was once the former Hutt Council depot and before that it was the Mangaroa Dairy factory.

**World War One Maymorn Army Camp**. During WW1 a temporary Army Base was established at the end of MacLaren Road.
