PINEHAVEN SCHOOL STORY

Pinehaven School was not completed when it opened on 21 June 1954. The official opening was held the following year on the 30 June 1955. The head teacher was Miss Mary Garvey and the assistant teacher was Mrs O'Neill.

Pinehaven School was built on Section No 193 part 32. The Pinehaven Recreation Reserves was situated on part 31. George Sykes was the original owner of Section No 193 and received the Crown Grant for the land in the 1870s.

The school fronts Pinehaven Road with the office entrance from Forest Road in Pinehaven.

Upper Hutt Leader 02 March 1950

What is to be done to the Schools in and around Upper Hutt – Reports from the Education Board dealing with the additions to the present school and also new school have been released through the Board member Mr A E Robinson.

At Silverstream it was recommended that two additional classrooms be added. The Board has however decided that a three class room school be built at Pinehaven on the new school site this will relieve the Silverstream School and save conveyance from Pinehaven every day.

At Trentham the requirements were for two further classrooms the Board recommends that a new infant school be erected on land recently acquired to the west of the existing school (gift by Mr G Cottle).

For Upper Hutt tenders will be called as soon as plans are completed for a nine roomed school on the Coltman Estate [Oxford Crescent]. This when completed will relieve the heavy overflow at present in the existing school.

Mangaroa School – The Works Committee of the Education Board resolved that in view of the fact that the existing classroom at Mangaroa was not a standard size room and that also the

Whiteman's Valley building came into the same category the matter be examined with a view to seeing whether it would not more economical to provide a permanent standard room. At present 39 children and two teachers are in one small classroom at Mangaroa and urgent relief is immediately required.

New School for Pinehaven – The erection of a new school of two classrooms at Pinehaven is provided for in the School Buildings Programme for the current year. Advice to this effect has been received from the Minister of Education (Hon R M Algie) by the member for the district Mr J J Maher. In a letter in reply to Mr Maher's personal representations in the matter Mr Algie says that the new school will be in accordance with the basic primary plans and the ground development proposals are at present under discussion between the Education Board and the Department. Mr Algie says that it is expected that the Wellington Education Board will soon be authorised to call tenders for the erection of the new school.

Pinehaven School Parents' Petition - A petition signed by 19 of 26 Pinehaven parents of school children at present attending Silverstream School was not opposing the opening of a new school at Pinehaven says Mr H K Milne chairman of the Silverstream School Committee and a Pinehaven parent of two school children. The 19 parents concerned were opposed to the transferring of children in Standards 2 to 6 from Silverstream School to a two roomed school at Pinehaven in the coming most important years of their primary school life states the petition. We the parents of children resident in Pinehaven and attending Silverstream School in Standards 2 to 6 wish to register our strongest protest against the proposal of the Education Board to compel our children to enrol at the new Pinehaven School when it is opened says the petition. Our children, having for several years received the benefits of education in a large school we feel it would be an unjust and retrograde step to force them now to attend a two roomed two teacher school in the coming most important years of their primary school life. The provision of a school at Pinehaven to cater for all infants and children up to Standard 1 had the wholehearted support of all parents and the Silverstream School Committee said Mr Milne. At the meeting of the Combined School Committees Federation the above matter was fully discussed and the following resolution was passed. That this meeting views with concern the suggested use of compulsion by the Wellington Education Board by taking pupils from the Silverstream School to the Pinehaven School. Further this meeting feels that unless extreme congestion at any school has taken place there has been no good grounds for forcing any particular children to attend any particular school.

Pinehaven School Gala - On Saturday 17th November 1956 in a lovely natural setting at Pinehaven School a most successful Gala was held in brilliant sunshine. The Gala was exceptionally well attended by resident's school children and visitors among whom were the Member for the District Mr P N Holloway MP, the Mayor Mr R H E Slacke and the Deputy Mayor Mr J B Buchanan. The Rt Hon. W Nash officially opened the function and complimented the committee on the work they were doing for the children. He mentioned that 93 children were enrolled in the school and he hoped that before long the century mark would be reached. Messrs Slack and Buchanan also addressed the gathering. Following the opening pupils gave demonstrations of singing dancing and gymnastics and while afternoon tea was being served to the official party a group of Scottish Country Dancers entertained the crowd. The packed stalls were readily patronised with the happy result that at the end of the afternoon the school funds were augmented by over £80. The committee heartily thanks all those who contributed towards the success of the first Gala to be held at the Pinehaven School.

Parents Teacher Association – The Fourth Annual Meeting of the Pinehaven School Parents-Teachers Association took place on 17th July. It was a well-attended and enthusiastic meeting at which the following officers were elected. President Miss M Garvey (Head Teacher), Secretary Mrs J Church, Treasurer (re-elected) Mr P Shaw, Committee, Messdames Nicholson, Mahood and Calvert (Teacher representative) and Messrs Baxendale and Head.

The retiring President Mrs P W Hunt and the secretary Mrs E Bloomfield and committee members were awarded a hearty vote of thanks for the successful years' work as detailed in the annual report. Special mention was made of guest-speaker evenings when we were privileged to have Mr Pat Macaskill (Adult Reading), Miss Nancy Martin (Music and Rhythm) and Mr Menzies Superintendent of Upper Hutt St. John Ambulance and his team (Resuscitation) also film evenings provided by Mr Blacken and Mr Watson. An attendance banner for parents at the meetings which was designed and made by a Form 1 pupil Geoffrey Park was finally won for the year by the senior class room. On behalf of the School Committee Mr W Forbes made a presentation to Mrs M Drylie Infant Mistress recently retired. The Association had on order for the school a Vumax film strip projector. Various other articles of equipment had been purchased of which the Taranaki Climbing frame is providing the children with much healthy exercise and a great deal of pleasure. The swimming pool fund shows a steady increase. Miss Garvey thanked the parents for their interest in the school and their help and co-ordination during the past year especially those mothers who save the teachers so much valuable time by regularly escorting the upper class to and from manual lessons. The announcement that the first steps towards the erection of fourth classroom was very welcome. Following the routine business the subject of Intermediate schools with particular reference to the Education Department's proposal for the Upper Hutt district provided a lively and interesting discussion. The retiring president presented the opinions of various knowledgeable people and associations and parents contributed their own garnered information and their own experiences of Intermediate schools. Finally, Mr Brough summed up and presented a strong case against these schools under the present system. The Pinehaven parents voted unanimously in expressing their disapproval of the possibility of their having to send their children to an intermediate school at Fraser Crescent Upper Hutt.

Education - At the last meeting of the Pinehaven School Parent Teachers Association presided over by Mr P A Shaw the President stressed the need to build up the Learner' Pool Fund. Money was required to complete the ultimate installation of a filtration plant. It was decided to devote the proceeds from the forthcoming Sports Day to the Fund. The Head Teacher Mr W J McDowall reported that to accommodate the rising roll the Education Board had called for tenders for the erection of a temporary classroom. It was hoped the Department would approve additional permanent rooms next year.

Upper Hutt Leader 28 February 1963

Pinehaven School Parent Teachers Association - In presenting his report the President Mr P A Shaw explained that it covered more than the customary year as the Annual Meeting date was changed from July 1962 to February 1963. Mr Shaw mentioned that the sum of £670 which was raised came mainly from the following sources, Gala, sports day, raffles, bottle drive and sale of firewood. The main items of school equipment which had been bought were an electric urn, tape recorder, record player, motor mower, material for erection of dressing sheds and other items such as books, etc. Chief functions were Gala and Sports Days, Fancy Dress Balls and the annual Christmas Party. At the monthly open meetings an endeavour was made to present an attractive and educational programme. In 1961 talks were given by Mr Ryder of the NZ Forest & Bird Protection Society and Sgt. Twentymen of Hutt Police and there was a demonstration of mouth to mouth resuscitation. In 1962 several film evenings were presented covering child development, NZ Animal Life and the Canadian scene. Other speakers were Mr Butcher of the NZ Educational Institute, Mr Potter of the Cancer Campaign Society and Miss Lenihan Infant Adviser. Mr Shaw thanked the School Committee, parents and supporters of the School, Mr McDowall (Head Teacher), Mrs McDowall and the staff and also the retiring Committee for their help and support. Good wishes were expressed to the incoming Committee. The following P.T.A. Committee was elected, President Mr L R Willmot; Vice-President Mr A W Jones, Hon Secretary Mr E G Handley, Hon Treasurer Mr S A Astwood, Committee Mesdames Brandjes, Griffin, Jarvis, O'Connell, Watson, Messrs Kleinjan, McDowall (Head Teacher) Hon Auditor Mrs W A Malcolm.

Shirley was a foundation pupil at the school, son Stuart and his brother Andrew both attended the school and Stuart has since settled in Pinehaven with his wife Rochelle and five children. Ryan was the first of the third generation to carry on the family's association with the school while Blair currently attends and Ethan starts in October (girls Sophia and Olivia are the youngest of the Smallbone clan). When Shirley started Pinehaven School as a Standard Four student in 1954, there were just 62 pupils, and only two classrooms. "Back in those days Pinehaven didn't have a sewerage system or running water - you didn't admit to living in Pinehaven," she recalls. "The grounds weren't developed then either, it was just mud and paddocks with a stream running through it." But what the school lacked in resources it made up for in friendliness, she says. "My two and a half years at Pinehaven School were the happiest of my life." Shirley says she wouldn't have thought of bringing up a family anywhere but in Pinehaven.

Fendalton Reserve access is off Fendalton Crescent in the Pinehaven district. In 1954 Grimes and Browning Ltd purchased land to develop the Fendalton subdivision and used a Canterbury theme when naming the streets.

Pinehaven District was named after the Pine trees growing in the district

Pinehaven Library Reserve is situated off Pinehaven Road in the Pinehaven district. The Pinehaven Library is situated on the Library reserve.

Pinehaven Reserve is situated off Pinehaven Road in the Pinehaven district. The Pinehaven School and the Silverpine Scout Hall are both situated in the Reserve

Streets - Forest Road was named after the Forest planted in the area by Goodwin & Chichester. When the forest was harvested Goodwin & Chichester developed the land and named the streets in the subdivision. The Forest has long gone but some trees still grow in the Pinehaven area. Goodwin & Chichester gifted to the residents of Upper Hutt the Pinehaven Reserve where some of the original trees planted by the company are still growing. It was not named after Father Jean Forest (John, 1804-1884) the Catholic Priest who founded the Hutt Mission in 1850.

Streets - Pinehaven Road was named after the Pine Trees (Sequoia) growing in the vicinity. In 1926 one million Pine trees were planted in the area by Sir Francis Chichester and his partner Geoffrey Goodwin. The area became known as the Pinehaven district. Later when the trees were harvested the partners developed and subdivided the land in Pinehaven. The 1951 Deller subdivision records Pinehaven Road and continued the tree theme when naming Forest Road and Birch Grove. Pinehaven Road was recorded in the Wisers NZ Post Office Directory 1961-1962. The partners Chichester and Goodwin donated land for a public reserve and the footbridge is a feature in the Pinehaven Reserve.

Wyndham Park is situated on the hill above Wyndham Road in the Pinehaven district. Wyndham was named after Wyndham Geoffrey Mallaby Goodwin (1924-2014) the son of Geoffrey Denzil Mallaby Goodwin one of the developers of the Pinehaven subdivision
