The two bridesmaids Miss May Banks (sister of the bridegroom) and Miss E Foster were attired in charming Empire frocks of pink linen over soft silk, trimmed with tulle and black ribbon velvet. Their large picturesque black silk Merry Widow hats were trimmed with shell pink roses and quantities of tulle and black ribbon velvet strings. The bridegroom's gifts to the bridesmaids were handsome gold bee brooches. The bridegroom was attended by Mr Harry Banks as best man and Mr T E Thompson groomsman. The ceremony was performed by the Rev Samuel Compton MA. After the ceremony a reception was held in the Century Hall. The fortunate couple received some costly and handsome presents from many parts of New Zealand. Mr and Mrs Banks left for Sydney via Wellington by the evening train, amid a shower of confetti. #Lieutenant Henry Dunbar Banks reported killed in action on 04 November was well-known in Wellington. He was a son of the late William Dunbar Banks formerly Town Clerk at Hokitika and was born at Hokitika. He was educated first at Napier Main School, then at Terrace School Wellington, Wellington College and Victoria College. For several years he was accountant to the legal firm of Messrs Buller and Anderson, now known as Messrs Buddie and Anderson. Later he entered the teaching profession and at the time of his enlistment held a position under the Wellington Education Board. He left New Zealand as second lieutenant with the Twenty-second reinforcements in March 1917 and was wounded in France in October of that year. When convalescent he was appointed a platoon commander in the 3rd Reserve Battalion of the Wellington Regiment at Sling Camp, where he received his promotion. In September last he was sent across to France and news of his death in action came through last week. Lieutenant Banks was a brother of Mr W A D Banks clerk of the Magistrate's Court Christchurch, and of Mrs Stanley of Upper Hutt whose husband Private T J Stanley died of influenza on board the transport that carried the Fourteenth Reinforcements reference Papers past website Hokitika Guardian newspaper 02 December 1918

#Brief story regarding his connection to the Upper Hut District = Henry Dunbar (Harry) Banks was born 10 Apr 1881 Hokitika New Zealand. His parents were Maria Louisa nee Griffiths (1840-1912) and William Dunbar Banks (1830-1894) and they had ten children. In 1911 Henry, his widowed mother Maria and two sisters all resided in Upper Hutt. In 1913 Mr H Banks was the teacher at Karapoti School. The 1914 Hutt Electoral Roll recorded Henry Banks school teacher Upper Hutt. The 04 Dec 1915 local Hutt Valley Independent newspaper reads "Brevities – Lieut. HM Banks took command of the local Senior Cadets Company last Monday". From 04 Sep 1915 to 22 Jul 1916 the local newspaper reads "Our Boys - Registered for Service – Harry Banks". The 29 Jul 1916 local newspaper reads "Our Boys - On June 17 we announced that Senior-cadet Lieut. Harry Banks was to receive a commission in the 22nd Reinforcements – he only got official notice five weeks after he read of it in this paper. Goes into camp in August". The 26 Aug 1916 local newspaper reads "Our Boys – Harry Banks (school teacher) has gone into camp – 2nd Lieut. In the 22nd (Reinforcements)". The 10 Mar 1917 local newspaper reads "Our Boys School-teacher Harry Banks formerly of the 22nd is now leaving with the 23rd". The 10 Nov 1917 local newspaper reads "Our Boys Imperishably Honoured Second Lieutenant Harry D Banks of Te Marua is reported to be wounded".
