Dear Sir

Mr W Mason who lately bought from the Government Land adjoining me has in running off his boundary thrown me 4 chains Eighty or ninety Links onto Mr Walter Hoder (Hodder) and has Mr Walter Hoder (Hodder) had his run off by Mr W Corbet and as Mr Mason had Mr McManaway for the same purpose to the Surveyors who have been employed by the Government I should wish you to send some surveyor to at least lay off the boundary on the road frontage as it is there that the dispute is grounded as yet and ask they (the Surveyors) both profess to have taken the view as a guide the difference of 5 chains would indicate the need of caution on my part to avoid litigation that might be memoirs. I should therefore feel it as an obligation if you would help me in this matter at the same time it seems so ludicrous that two professed surveyors should make a difference of five chains in the measuring of twenty five or six chains added by interments that one would think that they mean four but as Mr Mason is improving that taken and Mr Hoders (Hodder) has warned me against improving the land on the other side I am compelled to treat it seriously.

The deceased was an old resident of the Grey goldfields and lived for a long time at Totara Flat and Ahaura working as a carpenter and sawyer. He was a well-educated man an old colonist at one time in affluent circumstances having formerly been it is said a member of the House of Representatives for some constituency in the Province of Wellington. From a summary of the evidence given in the Greymouth Star it appears that deceased was discovered lying face downwards in about six inches of water just beneath a tramway bridge situate about 50 yards above the township with a severe wound on his temples. Corbett was last seen alive about two o'clock on Friday morning at which time he left No Town to go to his tent situate up the creek. He had been attending an entertainment but was not the worse for drink. It is supposed that he slipped from the bridge (a dangerous structure to cross in the darkness) and the wound on his forehead was caused by his falling on a sharp-edged stone which might have stunned him in which state he was suffocated through being unable to raise his head. The circumstances attending his death were mere conjecture warranted by the position in which the body was found. The jury returned an open verdict.

The deceased lady had resided in Wellington for the last 18 or 19 years but prior to that she lived with her husband who for many years kept the Aglionby Arms Hotel at the Lower Hutt. Both were well-known throughout the whole of the Wellington district. The late Mrs Corbett lost her husband some years ago, he being accidentally killed at Greymouth. She arrived in Wellington in the Tyne in 1841 and at the time of her death was 65 years of age but she had lived to see her family of sons and daughters all married and comfortably settled in various parts of the colony. One son Mr J H Corbett was well known in the Wairarapa district having resided at Masterton for some considerable time. The funeral took place on Saturday the body being conveyed from Wellington to the Hutt the burial service being conducted by the Rev J Jones.
