John HARTLEY was a juror at the inquest of Nathaniel TRENCH held on 15 January 1870 at the Pakuratahi Hotel between the Remutaka Hill and Upper Hutt. There was an accident which occurred at the Pakuratahi on the 16th instant at six pm. It appears that a man of the name of Nathaniel Trench who used to work at the saw mills but who has latterly been employed on the roads fell under a loaded wagon belonging to Mr Haywood which passed over his body crushing him almost literally to death. He died from the internal injuries sustained to about eleven pm. An inquest will be held at Mr Mason's Pakuratahi Hotel on the 15th instant (this day)

WILFORD one of the Coroners for the said Colony on an Inquisition then and there taken on view of the body of John HARTLEY then and there lying dead as follows to wit:-

William LEACH being sworn said that

I have been employed as roadman lately in company with deceased John HARTLEY. On Wednesday September 20th I was working on the road with deceased, I was about six yards from him, he was removing the hill-side getting metal when I heard some earth fall, looking round I witnessed HARTLEY and father who was alongside shouted that HARTLEY might be under the earth that had fallen. We removed the earth & found him lying on his face, deceased never survived or breathed after we got him out.

I have heard deceased speak of having a brother in Australia. He has no relatives in New Zealand (signed) William LEACH

George Wise LEACH being sworn corroborated the evidence of the previous witness giving the jury the exact position of deceased when the earth was removed from him (signed) G W LEACH Colony of New Zealand To wit:-

An Inquisition indented taken for of our Sovereign Lady the Queen at the house of Annie COLLINS known by the name of "The Mungaroa Hotel" Mungaroa in the said Colony on the Twenty first day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and seventy one before John G F WILFORD one of the coroners of our Sovereign Lady the Queen for the said Colony on view of the body of John HARTLEY, then and there lying dead upon the oath of John WILKINS foreman – Thomas BARTON – Charles COLLINS – William T SPACKMAN – George HALL – John EDWARDS – Thomas WALDIN – Phillips DAVIS – John BENGE and, Robert HOOPER – Edward MORGAN – Peter ATKIN

Good and lawful men of the neighbourhood duly chosen and who being there and then duly sworn and charged to inquire for our Lady the Queen when, how and by, what means the said John HARTLEY came to his death do upon their oaths sat – That

The Deceased John HARTLEY was accidentally killed by the fall of some earth whilst following his usual occupation of road-maker on Wednesday the twentieth day of September one thousand eight hundred and seventy one
