Town Land – Hutt County – Town of Mawaihakona.

The lots are situated on part section No 95 and record No 2 Line (Camp Road), Ararino Road, Totara Road, Tawai Road and Main Road (Fergusson Drive), the Wellington Napier Railway Line, Railway platform and Wellington Racing Club Course. Amos Howell purchased lots number 1, 2 and 3.

Lot 1, 2 & 3 on the north corner of Camp Road & Main Road was purchased by Amos Howell

Lot 36 on Camp Road was written M Dow (next to Howells land)

1917 = Oval photo of Howell's homestead being built on the north corner Camp Road and Fergusson. To the right is the blacksmith shop of Amos Howell senior. Amos was a JP and Councilor for Upper Hutt Borough Council from 1926 to 1937.

1917 = Large photo of Howell's homestead on the corner Camp Road and Fergusson. To the right is the blacksmith shop of Amos Howell senior. Many people remember the house as for many decades it was covered in green ivy.

1931 = Howell Motors Ltd Service Station building built on the south corner of Camp Road and Fergusson Drive. Note the Ford logo on the front of the building facing Fergusson Drive and below the petrol pumps (perhaps Shell) situated next to the road making easy access for vehicles to get fuel.
