Accidents – Lately accidents have been more numerous than we have known for a long time past. On Saturday one of a serious character happened to Mr William Mason senior just outside his residence in Molesworth Street. He was mounted on a horse occasionally given to bucking and whether Mr Mason was not in the stirrups or whether he was off his guard it unfortunately happened that he was thrown close to his own gate. Concussion of the brain took place and he was wholly insensible until Tuesday and Dr Johnston has hopes that he will recover much more quickly than his age might have led his friends to have expected.

Dear Sir

<u>Mr W Mason</u> who lately bought from the Government Land adjoining me has in running off his boundary thrown me 4 chains Eighty or ninety Links onto <u>Mr Walter Hoder (Hodder</u>) and has <u>Mr Walter Hoder (Hodder</u>) had his run off by <u>Mr W Corbet</u> and as <u>Mr Mason</u> had <u>Mr McManaway</u> for the same purpose to the Surveyors who have been employed by the Government I should wish you to send some surveyor to at least lay off the boundary on the road frontage as it is there that the dispute is grounded as yet and ask they (the Surveyors) both profess to have taken the view as a guide the difference of 5 chains would indicate the need of caution on my part to avoid litigation that might be memoirs. I should therefore feel it as an obligation if you would help me in this matter at the same time it seems so ludicrous that two professed surveyors should make a difference of five chains in the measuring of twenty five or six chains added by interments that one would think that they mean four but as Mr Mason is improving that taken and <u>Mr Hoders</u>

(Hodder) has warned me against improving the land on the other side I am compelled to treat it seriously.

Wellington District Court – Tuesday 10 April (Before Mr Justice Ward) The Court opened at 10 am Mason v MacManaway

This case had been adjourned from the previous sitting to amend the declarations. Mr Buckley appeared for the plaintiff and Mr H Brandon for the defence. In this case a claim of £100 was made, one the ground that the plaintiff had been placed on land by the defendant, but that after the plaintiff had been some time in occupation and had made improvements, it was found that the boundaries, as marked by defendant, were wrong, and the plaintiff was therefore obliged to purchase the land and improvements a second time at considerable extra expense.

Plaintiff deposed that on the 25th of January 1865, he had arranged with defendant that he should select him a piece of land at Pakuratahi. Had gone with defendant who had pointed out the boundaries of the land on which he was to settle. Paid for the land as pointed out by defendant.

<u>William Mason the son of plaintiff</u>, sworn I went according to instructions <u>from my father up to the</u> <u>Pakuratahi, and saw the land</u> pointed out by defendant. MacManaway recommended my father to buy 60 acres besides the land we originally intended to take, and he did so. About a month after my father had paid for the land at the Land Office, MacManaway came up and chained off the land and pointed us out the boundaries. He stopped at about half-a-chain from Harts whare. Hart then said that he always thought that that was his land. I fenced from the spot pointed out by defendant, as I was told by him that I was safe in doing so. When the Government Surveyor came up he differed about half-a-chain from the boundary pointed out by Mr MacManaway, so that all the improvements and fencing which we had done on what we supposed to be our land proved to be on Hart's land. Those improvements cost us about £130. We had to purchase this land from Mr Hart. The Government Surveyor valued the disputed piece of land at £77. The other items charged for are for necessary expenses that we were put to in getting Mr MacManaway to survey the land and point out boundaries. This concluded the case for the plaintiff. His Honor considered that no case had been shown, and, therefore, he must record a non-suit. Mr Buckley consented.

John Campbell v William Mason - action to recover £9, the alleged value of a bullock driven off plaintiff's land by defendant, at the orders of the executors of the estate of Mr Mason, senior. Mr Borlase appeared for the plaintiff and Mr Izard for the defendant. Mr Izard contended that the proper parties to be sued were the executors, and that no action could be taken against his client, who had only been acting under instructions. Mr Borlase objected on the grounds that an illegal act had been committed by defendant. The facts of the case were simply as follows - The late Mr Mason, father of the defendant, had a quantity of cattle depasturing on the lands of the plaintiff, and some years ago drove them off, leaving a sickly calf, unable to travel, on the ground as a present to the plaintiff. Time went on, and the calf grew strong, and was now a valuable bullock. Mr Mason senior was dead, and his son had without notice driven the animal away and taken possession of it, an act for which he was responsible. His Worship ruled that the action should have been brought against the executors of the estate, and entered a non-suit. (*Reference Papers past website Evening Post newspaper 11 March 1867*)

"Mason's Steps" – To the Editor Sir - Now that the City Council has made new steps in the above locality, and as many recent arrivals do not know the origin of the steps, a few words in explanation may be useful. "Mason's Steps" were called after Mr William Mason, who had a blacksmith shop at the back of the now occupied by Mr George Mee's chemist shop. Mr Mason arrived in Wellington in 1842 in the "London". He carried on his business there for some years, and later on his son Mr William Frederick Mason, continued the business, and also that of an ironmonger in premises abutting on Lambton-quay.

In those days, and not many years afterwards, "Mason's Steps" were only steps in name, there was nothing more than a rough track through the manuka scrub, which track was used then, as the steps are now, for a short cut from Lambton-quay to Wellington Terrace. On the opposite side of the lane was a draper's shop erected and kept by Mr Cox, and these premises were afterwards occupied by another family named Mason as a dyer's and millinery shop, but this was

a good many years afterwards, and the lane and steps took the name "Mason's Steps" from Mr Mason, as narrated above. Mr William Frederick Mason (who in after years was an inspector for the City Council) and Mr John Astill one of our oldest and respected settlers, and who still resides in Wellington, were brothers-in-law. They married sisters of the late Mr William Salmon.

It is many, many years since I first used "Mason's Steps", and my first remembrances of them was as a steep, slippery, and uneven track. The late Mr George Anderson, when a city councillor, took great pleasure in being the first man to have the steps laid down in concrete, and often that respected old settler used to ask his friends, with glowing pride, "What, do you think of them steps?" Many of the old settlers who used the steps have now "crossed the bar". Peace be to their ashes. I am, etc.,
