Maternity services were provided by a number of qualified midwives before and during Dr Kemp's time. Nurse Sarah Dalton called in people in their homes. Other qualified people moving into the district were Nurse White of Quinn's Post and Sister Cooper. Mrs Hodgetts took in maternity cases at her home on the later site of Heretaunga Post Office. It was operating as early as 1893 when A J McCurdy wrote to his wife care of that address.

Nurse Louise Renshaw a registered midwife started a maternity home in 1920. It was understood to be Upper Hutt's first hospital. This nurse was also a good cook a consideration in an area when patient's after-care lasted for some time. Her husband and accountant at Trentham Camp was an early riser who would have the fire going and the water hot before he moved off in the morning. The conventional four roomed house was in Victoria Street off Pine Avenue one of only three houses in the area at the time. It had its lounge set up as a theatre. Dr Kemp the only doctor did minor operations such as adenoids and tonsils on the dining room table. A step daughter remembered the date of the first birth 12 January it was Nurse Renshaw's birthday.

Two Trainees were to set up services of their own. Mrs Helen Lomas from a Main Road farm and Mrs Ruby Smith who lived opposite Nurse Renshaw's were both widows who helped at Victoria Street then trained formerly at St Helens before starting their own practice. Nurse Lomas on her own in 1927 after shifting to Copthorne at the end of Russell Street (opposite where Woolworths opened in a later age). Nurse Smith started Braeburn in 1933.

Mrs June Kelly formerly June Campbell of the sawmill villages at Karapoti and Hukinga was born at Nurse Lomas's along with her sisters. She told the writer in 1990 it was her mother's outing visiting Nurse Lomas on a Saturday afternoon with her youngest child while the older ones went to the Record Hall movies.

Upper Hutt's first Plunket nurse, Nurse Ogilvie stayed at Renshaw's in the mid-1920s, Mrs Daisy Downing, one of Nurse Renshaw's two step-daughters said of Nurse Ogilvie, "I admired her so much. She travelled miles on her bike to sick babies. She loved her babies. I remember one

night in a storm my father seeing her off safely to a very sick baby at Silverstream with only a carbide light on her bicycle".

Nurse Ogilvie later married businessman T N Gibbs formerly of Christchurch. Their son Colin Gibbs followed his father at Hazelwood's and grandson Michael was third generation at the store. Nurse Renshaw closed her hospital in 1927 although she continued nursing in Lower Hutt and Wellington. Nurse Lomas was getting established and Nurse Smith was about to train. Nurse Lomas was accommodating five patients at a time. Mrs Smith's Victoria Street accommodation up to seven patients. It was subsidised by the Wellington Hospital Board for its last nine years after the closure of Nurse Lomas's service about 1945. The board operated Braeburn direct until it was closed extended and reopened as a rest home. Nurse Renshaw's house burned down in 1930

Kenny Method Infantile Paralysis Hospital Magnificent Gift - Next month a hospital for the treatment of infantile paralysis by the Kenny Method will be opened at Silverstream Wellington. The hospital will be in charge of <u>Sister Dryden</u> an assistant matron at Wellington Hospital who spent 14 months in the years 1943-44 in the United States investigating and studying the Kenny method. Sister Dryden's trip to America was financed by Mr and Mrs T A Duncan of Hunterville and it is these people who have purchased the property at Silverstream and who are financing Sister Dryden in her dramatic venture to help unfortunates stricken with the terrible scourge of infantile paralysis. It was at Mr and Mrs. Duncan's request that Sister Dryden went to America to investigate the Kenny method of treatment which has been a subject of controversy in medical circles for many years. What she saw there convinced her of its effectiveness. She undertook a course of training and returned to New Zealand with facts and figures which have resulted in the purchase by Mr and Mrs Duncan of the hospital property where the treatment of acute cases will be put into practice for the first time in New Zealand. Although taking no responsibility the Health Department has encouraged the undertaking in every way and the treatment will be observed and elaborated by two leading Wellington orthopaedic specialists who have offered their assistance. The Health Department' sympathetic interest has enabled Sister Dryden to obtain the necessary equipment and she stated that although she hoped that the treatment would come under social security Mr Duncan who had already spent many thousands of pounds was willing if necessary to continue to help.

Trained Technicians Only - The treatment which took an hour daily could only be administered by a skilled Kenny technician which meant that <u>Sister Dryden</u> would not be able to treat more than ten patients. In order to increase the number to twenty Mr Duncan was also willing to send to America for a nurse trained in the method. There would be no age limit of patients and no acute case would be refused treatment. All this was explained by <u>Sister Dryden</u> at a meeting yesterday afternoon when she addressed members of the committees of the Wellington Crippled Children Society and also the president chairman and executive council of the New Zealand Society. As the chairman of the executive Mr Ernest Hunt stated when introducing <u>Sister Dryden</u> everyone had heard about the Kenny treatment but few knew anything about it and although the Crippled Children Society could not I say it was going to support this venture it was anxious to know all

about the treatment. Sister Dryden first told the romantic story of Elizabeth Kenny's amazing career which began 40 years ago when she was only fourteen years of age and when seeking to cure her brother of a form of paralysis she studied with the aid of a home-made anatomical figure the relation of bones and muscles. Her brother's eventual cure and later after she had completed her hospital training and become a bush nurse the cure of a number of children in her district who contracted infantile paralysis during an epidemic amazed the doctors. During the Great War she served in a transport ship for three years and had a great deal of experience with This experience enabled her to distinguish between this disease and infantile paralysis which are often confused in the early stages. As infantile paralysis is most responsive to treatment in the early stages this is a great advantage. On her return to civilian life parents knowing of her success in connection with infantile paralysis brought their children to her. She commenced by treating them in her large home but even this was too small and with the support of fellow-citizens she started a clinic. Eventually two clinics were established in Brisbane and one in Sydney. Many doctors supported her but not all and brooking no denial Sister Kenny went to England. But it was the same there. She could not get general recognition. A clinic which was established in Sussex however is still going strong. She had not been long in England when the Australia Government realised what it had lost and asked her to return. The Government then thought that instead of just effecting cures she should be engaged in research and decided to send her to America where the universities were endowed with plenty of money to support such work.

At the Mayo Clinic - Sister Kenny took her ward with her and visited New fork and Chicago and in neither place met with any response. Then she went to the Mayo Clinic where she succeeded in interesting Dr Henderson head of the Orthopaedic section. An epidemic of infantile paralysis had just begun. Sister Kenny took over four cases and all made complete recoveries. The doctors then asked her to take all the cases she could manage. In 80 per cent of the cases she effected complete cures. For this work grateful parents gave her a hospital which they named the Elizabeth Kenny Hospital and which had accommodation for 108 patients. Later two more hospitals were donated for the furtherance of her work. Cases came from all over the States and doctors spent six months learning the treatment. An effort was now being made to establish clinics in New York and Washington in readiness for the next epidemic. The controversy about Sister Kenny stated Sister Dryden was not about her treatment but about her concept of the disease. Hers was totally different from that of the doctors but neither could prove they were right so it really did not make much difference Sister Dryden said. The Kenny method was also good for many disorders of muscular and nervous origin but Sister Kenny was herself only really interested in infantile paralysis. Any disrepute that had come her way was the fault of those who practised her methods without proper qualifications. Sister Dryden said that when Mr and Mrs Duncan asked her to go to America to study Sister Kenny's work she was not enthusiastic about the treatment but went with an open mind. She said she saw at once the wonderful results of the treatment when she watched Sister Kenny examining children who had suffered from infantile paralysis to see if they were quite fit to go home. She had been impressed by the way Sister Kenny examined every muscle and by the fact that every child was a perfect physical specimen. After several weeks of observation she decided to take the course of training and had only just completed it when the worst infantile paralysis epidemic in years swept the country there being 19,000 cases.

Sister Kenny May visit Dominion - There was a chance <u>Sister Dryden</u> said of Sister Kenny coming to New Zealand. She had a documentary film of her work which she would no doubt bring with her. She decided to have the film made when the grateful parents of one child she had cured sent her 30,000 dollars as a gift but she did not use the money for this purpose after all as Rosalind Russell the screen star who plays the name part in the entertainment film of Elizabeth Kenny's life insisted on paying the cost of the documentary film. This film when shown

in New York drew packed houses. It took over an hour to show and dealt with children in the acute stage of the disease. In thanking <u>Sister Dryden</u> for her address Sir Charles Norwood national president of the New Zealand Crippled Children Society said that he had seen infantile paralysis all over the world but had never seen it with the hope behind the scenes that she had described. He said he had watched Sister Kenny's career and had thought What a wonderful woman this must be. The opposition she had met would have swept an ordinary person off their feet and he felt she must be moved by some high influence so that nothing could daunt her. Sir Charles said he hoped the result of Mr and Mrs Duncan's great benevolence and generosity and <u>Sister Dryden's</u> work would be such that New Zealand would thank God for them.





#Writing of Rio de Janeiro, Mr A A Huggins, builder of Petone, who recently visited the Mother Country, makes some interesting observations. After describing the city and a proposal which is a foot to rebuild a great part of it, he continues as follows - "We remembered the cry of high rents in Wellington, and curiosity compelled us to make inquiries here, with the object of comparing both places. We found three-roomed cottages with stone floors and no conveniences 25s per week. The strange thing is that wages are by no means high. Bricklayers, carpenters, masons, and plasterers get seven to eight millrays per day, equal to about 5s 9d and 10s per day our money. Labourers, 5s to 6s per day. When we reckon the cost of living, which is also high, we marvel how the workmen can live there. The cost of rebuilding will not be as heavy as in Wellington, because all the old buildings are of brick and are to be used again. The new buildings will be three or four floors higher, thus saying some of the ground lost in street widening. I am informed that the reinforced concrete for buildings is a failure, as the rods buckle and break the walls in a heavy shake, and they cannot be repaired like brick or stone. Steel frame work is being tried successfully. There are many magnificent churches, occasionally one is in the way of the street improving scheme, and down it comes. We were unable to ascertain how compensation is arranged, but it cannot be on the New Zealand system, or it would cost about 50 millions, instead of the 5 million borrowed for the purpose. On the whole, it seems that in five years' time Rio will be one of; the most beautiful places on earth, but for the present we cannot help but sigh for our green and beautiful little country, and long to return to the Land of the Moa reference Papers past website Dominion newspaper 15 October 1908

Milk was freely supplied to Mrs Huggins by Mrs Harrison, and meat, vegetables and groceries were supplied on order. #Obituary - Mrs L E Huggins - On Sunday evening in St David's Presbyterian Church Upper Hutt, Rev G W Hunt made special reference to the loss St David's congregation had sustained in the passing of Mrs L Huggins, for many years an active member of St David's Church. The service was largely attended and appropriate hymns were sung. The choir rendered the anthem "What Are These That Are Arrayed in White Robes." Mrs F Benton sang as a sacred solo "Just For To-day." The preacher took his text from Matthew, 25th chapter, verses 22 and 23 "Well done, good and faithful servant; thou has been faithful over few things, I will make thee ruler over many things, Enter thou into the joy of thy Lord." In his address Mr Hunt said "In Christ's estimate of the future life it was remarked that there were two elements that were of great encouragement to believers. Many of our popular and common ideas of heaven were not those of Jesus Christ. In scores of hymns and devotional treatises there was more or less flamboyant sentiment. In the view of our Lord the world to come is a world of progress and of duty identity of character and the development of capacity. Rewards are to be conditioned, not by quantity but by quality of service. Might they not say with all sincerity of their late friend, "Well done, good and faithful servant." Looking back across the years I cannot think of a more fitting expression. If to feed the hungry, clothe the needy, visit the sick, is a bade of Christian citizenship, then our friend wears that badge today. From my own personal knowledge, I know of many instances of unselfish service rendered in the name of Christ to those in need. For ten years the late Mrs Huggins was secretary of St. David's Ladies Guild. In this capacity her labours were fruitful to a degree beyond her knowledge. St. David's owes much to her zeal and initiative. To be good occasionally, when the spirit moves, to work spasmodically and drop out of the race when inclination dictates, is not difficult, but to keep on keeping on in some form of Christian work and effort is a mark of goodness and fidelity which has its reward. The daughter of sawmiller Jack Campbell, Betty, June, Jo and Judy were born at <u>Nurse Lomas's</u> at Upper Hutt.

Two trainees were to set up services of their own. Mrs Helen Lomas from a Main Road farm and Mrs Ruby Smith who loved opposite Nurse Renshaw's were both widows who helped out at Victoria Street and then trained formerly at St Helen's before starting their own practices. Nurse Lomas started on her own in 1927 after shifting to Copthorne at the end of Russell Street (opposite where Woolworths opened in a later age). Mrs June Kally formerly Jane Campbell of the sawmill villages at Karapoti and Hukinga was born at Nurse Lomas's along with her sisters. She told the writer in 1990 it was her mother's outing, visiting Nurse Lomas on a Saturday afternoon with her youngest child, while the older ones went to the Record Hall movies.

Nurse Renshaw closed her hospital in 1927 although she continued nursing in Lower Hutt and Wellington. Nurse Lomas was getting established and Nurse Smith was about to train. Nurse Lomas was accommodating five patients at a time. Mrs Smith's Braeburn Victoria Street accommodation up to seven patients. It was subsidised by the Wellington Hospital Board for its last nine years, after the closure of Nurse Lomas's service about 1945.


#Death of Mrs S E Lomas – Medical services in the early days of Upper Hutt are recalled by the death at Plimmerton on Tuesday of last week of Mrs Sarah Ellen (Nellie) Lomas. She was aged 80. Mrs Lomas a widow conducted a maternity home "Copthorne" in Russell Street Upper Hutt from the days of Upper Hutt's pioneer resident medical practitioner Dr F W Kemp. At time the district was without a doctor particularly during World War I and the midwives of this time shouldered an added responsibility. Nurse Lomas retired about 1945 after serving for 20 years as a midwife. She continued to live in the Russell Street home no longer providing maternity service till about 1954 when she joined her married daughter at Tawa. A medical hospital in Upper Hutt was set up by Mrs Grace E Nelligan in Victoria Street in 1930. Nursing Sisters who later took charge were Lissaman and E McNeight. The later married the district's first solicitor Mr F N G Wakelin. In a letter from Awarere, Ahiaruhe, Carterton in 1953 Mrs Nelligan told the writer she arrived in Wellington with two children at the beginning of 1930. She was taken for a drive through Whitemans Valley. "As I passed through Upper Hutt with its many autumn tinted trees I felt I must make my home here".

After seeing Dr Kemp next day and getting little encouragement for a first hospital in the district but a promise of support she declined an agents offer of a six roomed house and was waiting for a bus to depart when she saw a picture of a property she was sure had possibilities. She bought the place and that night answered an advertisement for a nurse to take care of a chronically ill patient. She moved the patient into the house and also her own mother Mrs G J Wakelin who was to be her right-hand. "At that time the mountains were plainly visible and the house stood alone without others surrounding it".

She had all the additions and alterations done that where required for licensing for surgery. It was when her husband deteriorated that she got Sister in to manage. When her children at boarding school needed a home just before World War II she retrieved the property as a family home.

The funeral took place on Tuesday afternoon, under very adverse conditions, but notwithstanding the weather there were over 50 cars in attendance. The Rev G V Kendrick, Church of England, conducted the service, the first part in the church, and the latter at the graveside. Among those present were members of the farming and business community of Upper Hutt and surrounding district. There were many beautiful floral tributes, including some from the members of the family. The sympathy of residents is extended to the widow and family in their bereavement.

She travelled miles on her bike to sick babies. She loved her babies. I remember one night in a storm my father seeing her off safely to a very sick baby at Silverstream, with only a carbide light on her bicycle". Nurse Ogilvie later married businessman T N Gibbs, formerly of Christchurch. Their son Colin Gibbs followed his father at Hazelwoods, and grandson Michael was third-generation at the store.

The annual meeting is to be postponed indefinitely owing to the illness of the secretary and a letter was sent to Mrs Lodge wishing her a speedy recovery. Mrs Loveday Alice Louise RENSHAW – nurse/midwife private hospital Victoria Street 1920

Maternity services were provided by a number of qualified midwives before and during Dr Kemp's time. Nurse Louise Renshaw a registered midwife started a maternity home in 1920. It was understood to be Upper Hutt's first hospital. This nurse was also a good cook a consideration in an area when patient's after-care lasted for some time. Her husband and accountant at Trentham Camp was an early riser who would have the fire going and the water hot before he moved off in the morning. The conventional four roomed house was in Victoria Street off Pine Avenue one of only three houses in the area at the time. It had its lounge set up as a theatre. Dr Kemp the only doctor did minor operations such as adenoids and tonsils on the dining room table. A step daughter remembered the date of the first birth 12 January it was Nurse Renshaw's birthday.

Two Trainees were to set up services of their own. Mrs Helen Lomas from a Main Road farm and Mrs Ruby Smith who lived opposite <u>Nurse Renshaw's</u> were both widows who helped at Victoria Street then trained formerly at St Helens before starting their own practice. Nurse Lomas on her own in 1927 after shifting to Copthorne at the end of Russell Street (opposite where Woolworths opened in a later age). Nurse Smith started Braeburn in 1933.

Upper Hutt's first Plunket nurse, Nurse Ogilvie stayed at <u>Renshaw's</u> in the mid-1920s, Mrs Daisy Downing, one of <u>Nurse Renshaw's</u> two step-daughters said of Nurse Ogilvie, "I admired her so much. She travelled miles on her bike to sick babies. She loved her babies. I remember one night in a storm my father seeing her off safely to a very sick baby at Silverstream with only a carbide light on her bicycle".

Nurse Ogilvie later married businessman T N Gibbs formerly of Christchurch. Their son Colin Gibbs followed his father at Hazelwood's and grandson Michael was third generation at the store. Nurse Renshaw closed her hospital in 1927 although she continued nursing in Lower Hutt and Wellington. Nurse Lomas was getting established and Nurse Smith was about to train. Nurse Lomas was accommodating five patients at a time. Mrs Smith's Victoria Street accommodation

up to seven patients. It was subsidised by the Wellington Hospital Board for its last nine years after the closure of Nurse Lomas's service about 1945. The board operated Braeburn direct until it was closed extended and reopened as a rest home. <u>Nurse Renshaw's</u> house burned down in 1930.

Nurse Louise Renshaw stands outside her home in Victoria Street. A registered midwife she transformed her residence into a maternity home on 12 January 1920 (or 1917 in some accounts). This is considered to have been the first hospital in Upper Hutt. The lounge was used as a theatre and Dr Kemp the sole doctor did minor operations on the dining room table. This photograph was taken in 1924. Nurse Elsie Ogilvie (later Elsie Gibbs) Upper Hutt's first Plunket nurse also stayed here with the Renshaw family during the 1920s. The house used to

stand at 5 Victoria Street one of only three houses in the area at that time. It burned down in the 1930s (1930 according to the 2005 article). The picture was used in the Upper Hutt - The History page 245. It was also printed in the Leader on 14 November 14 1989 with Nurse Renshaw's daughter Daisy Downing's reminiscences and a suggestion that if Elderslea closed Upper Hutt's maternity services would be back to square one. It was printed yet again on 31 July 1990 this time with an article from an interview with her son Peter Renshaw on his memories. In a 22 June 2005 obituary on Sonja Davies a prominent Labour politician and member of the New Zealand Order of Merit, Peter Renshaw mentioned that she has been born in this house in 1923 and was an occasional visitor with her mother Gwladys Vile. The article said Mrs Renshaw had started the Upper Hutt Plunket branch in November 1923 and that the hospital had closed in the late 1920s when health department rules toughened.

Braeburn former Maternity hospital 14 Victoria Street – circa 1970

Braeburn was established by Nurse Ruby Smith in 1933 as a maternity hospital. In 1950 it was taken over by the Wellington Hospital Board Nurse Smith remained on the staff. When Elderslea in Redwood Street opened as a Maternity Hospital on 1 March 1961 Braeburn was closed. After several years it was bought by a Mrs Savage and opened as an aged person's home and continued in that role for some years. The 25 October 2000 Leader printed an article on its history the land and buildings were for sale by tender, closing on the 27th. The photograph was taken by Brian Pearce who was born in Braeburn. The 10 May 1993 Leader printed an article provided by Mary Eyles of the Parents Centre on changes in maternity care over the previous 40 years.
