Hera Katene was born in New town Wellington on 10th May 1919 [sic] to Hari Kakano Wi Katene of Ngati Toa and Te Atiawa/Naga Ruhine and Ngapera Kemara also known as Bella Campbell of Ngati Whatua and Te Rarawa descendant. From infancy Hera was fondly known as Dovey because her father often called her "Mr Little Dove". She inherited her looks and love of music from her mother Bella who was an accomplished pianist. Her father Hari was also musically inclined and was able to play several instruments. He was employed as a translator in the Maori Land Courts working between Wellington and Auckland. At School Dovey was involved in drama and music and began taking dance lessons at an early age. She loved to entertain. She was educated in Ponsonby Auckland and later in Te Wai Pounamu Girls College in Christchurch.

Aunty Dovey's involvement with Maori cultural groups began at Te Wai Pounamu in the late 1920's when Dovey became a part of a group called "The 2YA Concert Party" and later "The Young Maori Concert Party" under the direction of Sir Apirana Ngata, Henry Ngata and Bill Parker. In 1932 she toured with the Anglican Maori Mission Party.

Mr Whata Green (New Zealand Press Association) Wellington 18 December - Mr Whata Te Puaha Green one of New Zealand's greatest axemen and four times world champion died today at the Hutt Hospital. He was 62. During the 45 years he was an active competitor he won 14 axe championships including four world titles and was also champion of New Zealand and Australia. Born at Kawhia. Mr Whata Green was the son of Te Puaha Kirini and his wife Ngarino and came of Waikato stock. A man of splendid physique he became well known as a bushman both in the Waikato and in Taranaki in his younger days. He was successful in wood-chopping competitions in different parts of the country and also lived in Australia, where he competed with distinction. He is survived by his wife Mrs Dovie Green of Johnsonville Wellington and three sons and a daughter by a former marriage. Messrs William James and Whata Green junior are in the South Island and Miss Hine Green lives at Ratana.

Around 1954 Doris and Jim Lessels and family moved into a cottage at the Maymorn Railway Settlement in the Mangaroa Valley. Dovey and Arpid Horvath came to live there around the same time in the same street. This was the start of Doris and Dovey became life time best friends, some said they were like sisters. They both enjoyed going to the Trentham Racecourse together, attending all the international Rugby games in Wellington. On New Year's Eve they would dress up and while Doris played the squeeze box melodeon, Dovey would play the ukulele. The families would spent Christmas together, attend family 21st and weddings. Dovey taught the Lessels children and the Maymorn School children Maori songs for the school concert held after the Rimutaka Tunnel after the Rimutaka Tunnel was opened in 1955. The Lessels family became involved in the Mawai Hakona cultural group and fund raising for the Orongomai Marae.

Hera's husband Arpad HORVATH was unable to vote in New Zealand as he had not been naturalised. This is why he was not recorded on any Electoral Rolls.

During the 1960's Dovey helped with the founding organisation of Mawai Hakona Cultural Club. It was during those years that she encouraged by known song writer such as Jock McEwan and Bill Parker to compose her own material. These men realised Dovey's potential and with their encouragement her creative talents emerged. They were not disappointed as several times Dovey led Mawai Hakona to victory with winning compositions. Dovey achieved outstanding acclaim from adjudicators both regionally and nationally for choreography best song lyrics and pou. Her winning waiata included "I Nga Ra o Mua", "Hoea Mai Ra" used to powhiri Prince Charles to Wellington and "Te Ra Pouri" which was dedicated to the memory of the late Prime Minister Norman Kirk.

Before every performance Dovey went through the time consuming and gruelling routine of having a moko drawn on her chin and around her lips. One day the artist, Napi Waaka, suggested that it was about time she had it done permanently. Dovey was aware of the dramatic changes that wearing a moko would make to her life. She was delighted when she was visited by Tawai Te Rangi who had previously received a ta moko. Tawai reassured Dovey by explaining the procedure, making the appointment with the pakeha tattooist and then spending the evening together singing waiata and talking about the good old days. The following morning on the 26th of June 1975 they went together to the surgery of Roger Ingerton in Wellington where Dovey received her ta moko. Mr Ingerton refused payment for his services as he felt it was an honour to work on Dovey. However she repaid him with pounamu and other taonga. She recalled that the pain although intense was very brief lasting only a few second. There was no tohunga available to perform karakia throughout the procedure but all went well. She was also surprised

to find there was no swelling or other side effects and that evening she was able to go to her club practice and “cause a stir”. The pattern of her moko was taken from a photograph of her grandmother’s sister who died without issue so Dovey felt she was entitled to that particular pattern. Having a moko did indeed affect Dovey’s lifestyle. The first thing she did was give away all her makeup and her flamboyant clothes which she loved and resorted to wearing sombre attire. She also avoided going to hotels and other public places unbecoming of a lady of dignity. At the time Auntie Dovey was the last of our Ngati Toa women to wear a ta moko. Dovey’s years with Ngati Poneke and Mawai Hakona were fruitful and the honours that came to her were richly deserved. Unable to continue because of poor health she retired to Porirua to live out her days in a kaumatua flat among her own Ngati Toa people.

Arpad Ferenc / Frank HORVATH was naturalised in 13 October 1972.

Some thought it was a pity that success would only favour Davey public life. Dovey Katene Horvath was awarded a Q.S.M. for her outstanding contribution to Maoridom in culture, song and dance. She died in January 1987 age 74 after a long illness and is buried in the Katene Urupa in Pukerua Bay. Many people saw Dovey as a lonely figure. The last song she composed was titled “Disillusion”. I somehow feel that her final song with its haunting melody reflects much of her private life which she kept hidden from the world.

In the early 1980’s Dovey began her association with the New Zealand Maori Chorale and became a patroness. The group under the direction of Te Puoho Katene welcomed her into their midst and presented some of her songs on their record “Waiata Aroha” in a way that Dovey had not expected to hear her songs sung. The groups sang and recorded one of Dovey favourite compositions “Taupuhi” with the New Zealand Youth Orchestra. She was later approached by Ron Goodwin of the famous London Philharmonic Orchestra to request permission to use “Taupuhi”. Dovey gladly gave her consent.

She has a special affinity with nature. Dovey used to sit in the forest and become one with the trees, the birds and streams. She also loved the sea. This feeling became evident when she composed such songs as “Kua Eke Mai Ra”, “Hoea Ra”, “I Roto I te Ngahere”, “Toi Toi Toi” and “E Tangi e te Tai”. When Dovey had difficulty finding suitable tunes for her songs she would sometimes “borrow” the first two or three lines from a popular pakeha song and take it from there. She gained a reputation for being one of Aotearoa’s most noted Maori song writers and poi experts. Mawai Hakona have often been commended at cultural festivals for “best costume”. A considerable amount of time went into the selection of a suitable costume for the group.

Dovey was influenced by the apparel of some of her Ngati Toa tupuna. Photographs depicting Te Rauparaha wearing pohoi totoa (feathered ear adornments) and three Ngati Toa women wearing korowai studded with tiny red pompoms. This sparked the idea for Mawai Hakona's stunning and authentic costume. Dovey rubbed shoulders with many well-known dignitaries over the years. Among these were Rolf Harris, Ron Goodwin and Nana Mouskouri who all asked for permission to use some of her songs. She also met Kenny Rogers, the Fifth Edition, David Bowie, Cleo Lane and several diplomats and leading figures from New Zealand and other countries.

#Maori Lands Ownership Tangle Large Estate Involved - An Investigation concerning the ownership of land known as the Wakapuaka Block in the Nelson district awarded to a Maori as sole owner in 1883 was commenced in Wellington today before the Native Land Court. The petitioner in the case are the Ngatikoata Tribe, the Ngatitama Tribe, and the descendants of a branch of the family interested in the original gift of land. The respondents are the trustees administrating the estate of the last title-holder of the land on whom the property developed through the late Huri Matenge who was awarded the block in 883. The Court consists of Judge C E MacCormick, Judge H Carr and Judge J W Browne. Mr R Sim is appearing for Hari Katene and others, Mr A Elkington for the Ngatikoata Tribe, Mr H Stowell for the Ngatitama Tribe and Mr H F O'Leary K C and Mr H R Evans are representing the trustees of the estate. Evidence is being heard in the case which is likely to last for about ten days.
