The Upper Hutt public school established a World War One Roll of Honour memorial board. Some of the eighty five [85] Service Personnel named on the board served overseas, a few in New Zealand while others were reservists. Twenty one (21 +) personnel either died while serving or after discharge with their deaths attributed to war service.

The Hon C J Parr Minister of Education unveiled the honours board on 07 December 1920.

SCHOOL HONOURS BROAD

The unveiling of the honours' board at the Upper Hutt School took place on Saturday afternoon when the Hon C J Parr (Minister for Education), Mr T Forsyth (chairman of the Education Board), Mr W H Field M.P., and Mrs Field were present. The Minister said it gave him great pleasure to be present at such a gathering and spoke feelingly of all who had fallen in the Great War for the cause of freedom. Great praise was due to the teaching staff of the Dominion for the manner in which they had instilled into the boys recognition of their duty to King and Empire. Mr Forsyth and Mr Field having endorsed the Minister's remarks Mr Parr unveiled the board, all present standing in silence and subsequently singing the National Anthem. Cheers were given for the Minister and his party, who were then entertained by the school committee at afternoon tea.

UPPER HUTT SCHOOL – Unveiling of Honours Board

The unveiling of the above honours board took place last Saturday afternoon at the School, when the Hon C J Parr (Minister for Education), Mr T Forsyth (chairman of the Education Board), Mr W H Field M.P., for the district, were present to do honour to the brave boys who had gone away to "do their bit." After the chairman, Mr Guthrie, had introduced the Ministerial party, the Minister thanked the school committee for the kind invitation, and spoke feelingly of all who had fallen in the Great War for the cause of freedom, saying it involved great credit to our national form of education, and great praise was due to the teaching staff of the Dominion, for they had instilled into their boys the idea of duty to King and Empire. Honours boards, the Minister maintained, were a lasting memorial to the children of the future generations, for as they came to school this board would always be before them the great deeds their fathers and grandfathers did in the Great War.

Mr Forsyth agreed with the Hon Mr Parr with regard to the efficiency of the national system of education, although he stated many improvements could be made.

Mr Field also spoke, after which the Minister for Education unveiled the board, all present standing. The singing of the National Anthem brought the proceedings to a close. Three cheers were given for the Ministerial party, who, at the conclusion of the ceremony, were entertained by the School Committee at afternoon tea.

The unveiling of the Honour Board at Upper Hutt School took place on Saturday afternoon, at the school, when, the Hon C J Parr, Minister of Education, Mr T Forsyth chairman of the Education Board and Mr W H Field M.P. for the district, and Mrs Field, were present to do honour to the brave boys whose names appear on the board. After the chairman Mr Guthrie, had introduced the Ministerial party, the Minister spoke feelingly of all who had fallen in the Great War for the cause of freedom. The way the young men had answered the call reflected great credit on our national form of education. Great praise was due to the teaching staff of the Dominion, for they had instilled into their boys duty to King and Empire. At the first call the young men had gone out nobly, knowing what they had to go through, and they had won honour and respect all over the Empire for their attention to duty and good behaviour, both on and off the battlefield. Honours boards, the Minister maintained, were a lasting memorial to the children of the future generations, for as they came to school this board would always be before them, and serve to keep before them the great deeds their fathers and grandfathers did in the Great War. Mr Forsyth agreed with the Minister with regard to efficiency of our national system of education, although, he stated many improvements, could be made. Mr Field also endorsed the previous speaker's remarks. The Minister of Education then unveiled the board, all present standing. The singing of the National Anthem brought the proceeding to a close. Three cheers were given for the Ministerial party, who, at the conclusion, were entertained by the School Committee at afternoon tea.
